### **Definitions of "Guiding" as an adjective**

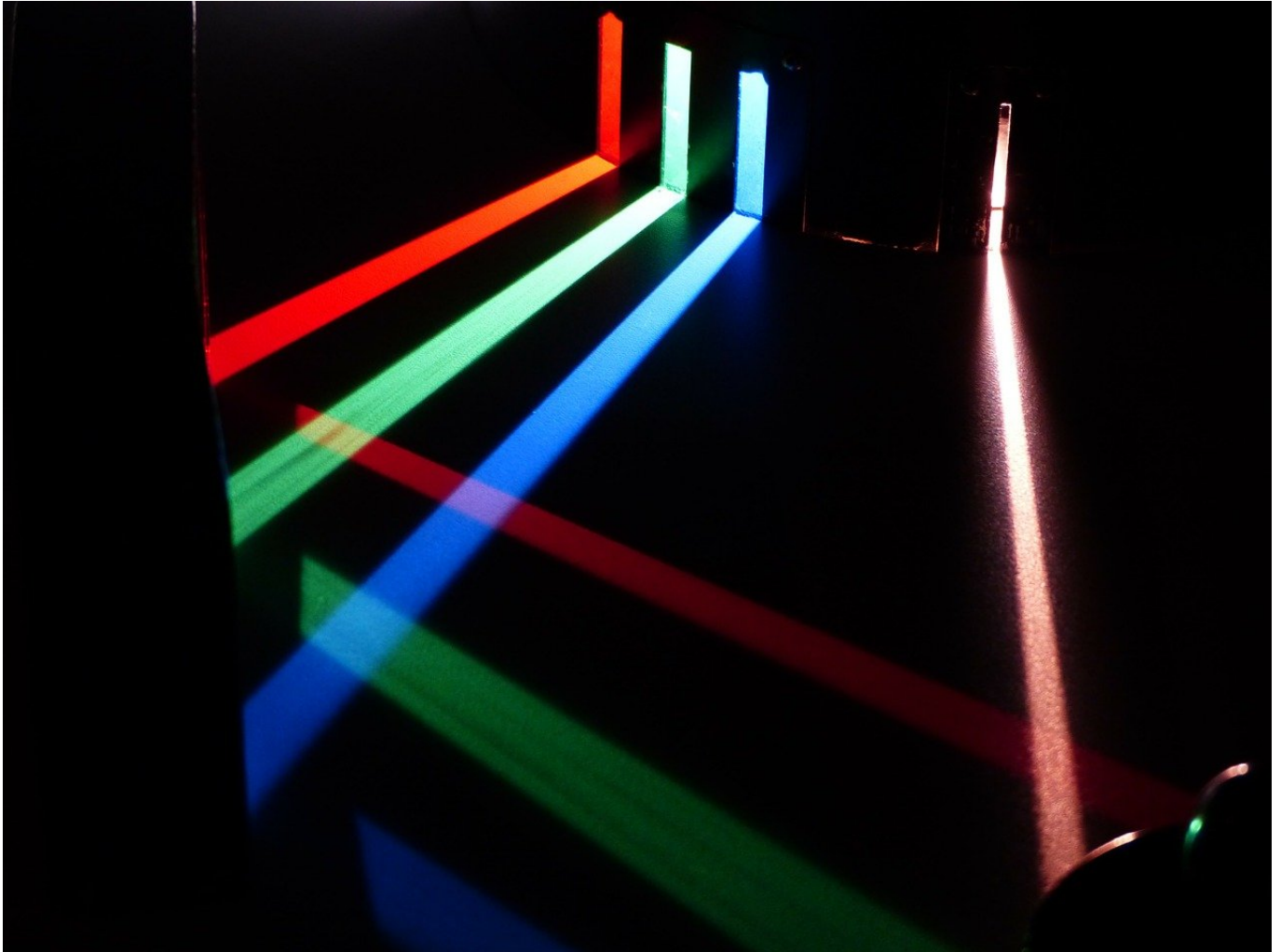
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “guiding” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Exerting control or influence.*



### Synonyms of "Guiding" as an adjective (3 Words)

- directing** Direct in spatial dimensions; proceeding without deviation or interruption; straight and short.  
*Felt his mother s **directing** arm around him.*
- directional** Having a particular direction of motion, progression, or orientation.  
*A **directional** womenswear designer.*
- directive** Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on.  
*The authority is seeking a **directive** role in energy policy.*

## Associations of "Guiding" (30 Words)

- antimony** A metallic element having four allotropic forms; used in a wide variety of alloys; found in stibnite.
- asterisk** Mark with an asterisk.  
*He had **asterisked** the things about the case that still bothered him.*
- bookmark** A record of the address of a website, file, or other data made to enable quick access in future.  
*Fans will want to **bookmark** this site.*
- catalog** Make a catalogue compile a catalogue.  
*He is **cataloguing** his photographic negatives.*
- catalogue** Enter an item in a catalogue.  
*The report **catalogues** dangerous work practices in the company.*
- clue** A slight indication.  
*A long pondered **clue** in a half completed crossword.*

	An idea or feeling which a word invokes for a person in addition to its literal or primary meaning.
<b>connotation</b>	<i>The word discipline has unhappy <b>connotations</b> of punishment and repression.</i>
<b>cue</b>	Give a cue to or for. <i>Have a list of needs and questions on paper to <b>cue</b> you.</i>
<b>denotation</b>	The literal or primary meaning of a word, in contrast to the feelings or ideas that the word suggests. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b>diacritical</b>	Capable of distinguishing.
<b>directive</b>	A pronouncement encouraging or banning some activity. <i>The boss loves to send us <b>directives</b>.</i>
<b>handbook</b>	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The <b>handbook</b> says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>Randall smiled with a <b>hint</b> of mockery.</i>
<b>index</b>	Link the value of prices wages or other payments automatically to the value of a price index. <i>She offered help in <b>indexing</b> my text book on bookselling.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>Heavy bleeding is a common <b>indication</b> for hysterectomy.</i>
<b>key</b>	A lever as in a keyboard that actuates a mechanism when depressed. <i>Nat turned the <b>key</b> in the ignition.</i>
<b>label</b>	Distinguish as a compound or molecule by introducing a labeled atom. <i>The alcohol content is clearly stated on the <b>label</b>.</i>
<b>lead</b>	A position of being the initiator of something and an example that others will follow especially in the phrase take the lead. <i>They didn't follow our <b>lead</b>.</i>
<b>leading</b>	The activity of leading. <i>A number of <b>leading</b> politicians.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Make underscoring marks. <i>The citizens <b>mark</b> the anniversary of the revolution with a march and a parade.</i>



<b>principle</b>	A fundamental truth or proposition that serves as the foundation for a system of belief or behaviour or for a chain of reasoning. <i>The <b>principle</b> of jet propulsion.</i>
<b>sign</b>	Commit oneself to work by signing a contract. <i>Wolverine <b>sign</b>.</i>
<b>signpost</b>	Indicate a place with a signpost. <i>Battle is clearly <b>signposted</b> off all the main roads.</i>
<b>solder</b>	Join with solder. <i><b>Solder</b> these two pipes together.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>The power of <b>suggestion</b>.</i>
<b>symptom</b>	An indication of the existence of something, especially of an undesirable situation. <i>The government was plagued by leaks a <b>symptom</b> of divisions and poor morale.</i>
<b>tab</b>	The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation. <i>The filing cards were organized by cards having indexed <b>tabs</b>.</i>
<b>tag</b>	Attach a tag or label to. <i>I will be <b>tagged</b> in every photo I post.</i>
<b>ticket</b>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. <i>The two winning <b>tickets</b> bought within days of each other went unclaimed.</i>
