- Exerting control or influence.






Synonyms of "Guiding" as an adjective (3 Words)

<u>directing</u>	Direct in spatial dimensions; proceeding without deviation or interruption; straight and short. <i>Felt his mother s directing arm around him.</i>
directional	Having a particular direction of motion, progression, or orientation. A directional womenswear designer.
<u>directive</u>	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. The authority is seeking a directive role in energy policy.

Associations of "Guiding" (30 Words)

antimony	A metallic element having four allotropic forms; used in a wide variety of alloys; found in stibnite.
<u>asterisk</u>	Mark with an asterisk. He had asterisk ed the things about the case that still bothered him.
<u>bookmark</u>	A record of the address of a website, file, or other data made to enable quick access in future. Fans will want to bookmark this site.
catalog	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>He is cataloguing his photographic negatives.</i>
catalogue	Enter an item in a catalogue. The report catalogue s dangerous work practices in the company.
<u>clue</u>	A slight indication. A long pondered clue in a half completed crossword.



<u>connotation</u>	An idea or feeling which a word invokes for a person in addition to its literal or primary meaning. <i>The word discipline has unhappy</i> connotation s of punishment and <i>repression.</i>
cue	Give a cue to or for. Have a list of needs and questions on paper to cue you.
denotation	The literal or primary meaning of a word, in contrast to the feelings or ideas that the word suggests. Beyond their immediate denotation the words have a connotative power.
diacritical	Capable of distinguishing.
<u>directive</u>	A pronouncement encouraging or banning some activity. <i>The boss loves to send us directives.</i>
handbook	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The handbook</i> says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.
hint	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. Randall smiled with a hint of mockery.
<u>index</u>	Link the value of prices wages or other payments automatically to the value of a price index. She offered help in index ing my text book on bookselling.
indicant	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. Symptoms are the prime indicant s of disease.
indication	A reason to prescribe a drug or perform a procedure. <i>Heavy bleeding is a common indication for hysterectomy.</i>
key	A lever as in a keyboard that actuates a mechanism when depressed. <i>Nat turned the key in the ignition.</i>
label	Distinguish as a compound or molecule by introducing a labeled atom. The alcohol content is clearly stated on the label .
lead	A position of being the initiator of something and an example that others will follow especially in the phrase take the lead. <i>They didn t follow our lead</i> .
leading	The activity of leading. A number of leading politicians.
mark	Make underscoring marks. The citizens mark the anniversary of the revolution with a march and a parade.



principle	A fundamental truth or proposition that serves as the foundation for a system of belief or behaviour or for a chain of reasoning. <i>The principle of jet propulsion.</i>
sign	Commit oneself to work by signing a contract. <i>Wolverine sign</i> .
signpost	Indicate a place with a signpost. Battle is clearly signpost ed off all the main roads.
solder	Join with solder. Solder these two pipes together.
suggestion	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. The power of suggestion .
symptom	An indication of the existence of something, especially of an undesirable situation. The government was plagued by leaks a symptom of divisions and poor morale.
<u>tab</u>	The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation. The filing cards were organized by cards having indexed tab s.
<u>tag</u>	Attach a tag or label to. I will be tag ged in every photo I post.
<u>ticket</u>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. The two winning ticket s bought within days of each other went unclaimed.
