- A recognized leader in some field or of some movement.






Synonyms of "Guru" as a noun (14 Words)

The person or team that is winning a sporting competition at a particular time. The leader of a protest group.
The activity of leading.
Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. The master of the Aylesbury Vale Hunt.

<u>teacher</u>	A personified abstraction that teaches. Books were his teacher s.
<u>tutor</u>	A person who gives private instruction (as in singing, acting, etc. <i>A voluntary tutor in adult literacy.</i>






Usage Examples of "Guru" as a noun

economist	An expert in the science of economics.
expert	Of or relating to or requiring special knowledge to be understood. I have a friend who is very expert at the language.
grammarian	A linguist who specializes in the study of grammar and syntax.
<u>historian</u>	A person who is an authority on history and who studies it and writes about it. <i>A military historian</i> .

protege	A person who receives support and protection from an influential patron who furthers the protege s career.
<u>scholar</u>	A university student holding a scholarship. A Rhodes scholar .
<u>school</u>	The period of instruction in a school the time period when school is in session. The whole school turned out for the game.
schoolmaster	A male teacher in a school.
semester	One of two divisions of an academic year. The opening week of Harvard s autumn semester .
specialist	Practices one branch of medicine. A specialist electrical shop.



<u>specialize</u>	Devote oneself to a special area of work. The firm specialize d in commercial brochures.
specialty	A distinguishing trait.
<u>spiritual</u>	Concerned with or affecting the spirit or soul. <i>Spiritual</i> beings.
study	A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study. The study of global problems.
taxonomist	A biologist who specializes in the classification of organisms into groups on the basis of their structure and origin and behavior.
teach	A teacher. The philosophy teach es self control.
<u>teacher</u>	A personified abstraction that teaches. A history teacher .
<u>technical</u>	Of or relating to a practical subject that is organized according to scientific principles. Analysts content that the stock market is due for a technical rally.
<u>tuition</u>	A sum of money charged for teaching by a college or university. <i>Private tuition in French.</i>
