anatomical	Relating to bodily structure. <i>Anatomical research.</i>
<u>athlete</u>	A person trained to compete in sports. <i>He had the broad shouldered build of a natural athlete.</i>
<u>auditorium</u>	The area of a theater or concert hall where the audience sits. <i>The stage was small and the auditorium had only 366 seats.</i>
cafeteria	A restaurant where you serve yourself and pay a cashier. <i>Employers who offer cafeteria plans and other flexible programs.</i>
<u>chair</u>	Act as chairperson of or preside over an organization meeting or public event. <i>He was awarded an endowed chair in economics.</i>
<u>classroom</u>	A room in a school where lessons take place.
<u>cushion</u>	Something providing support or protection against impact. <i>To cushion the blow wages and pensions were increased.</i>

dormitory	A college or university building containing living quarters for students. <i>He visited the boarders in their dormitory.</i>
<u>exercise</u>	Cause an animal to take exercise. <i>An exercise in cheap talk.</i>
fitness	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>If sharp teeth increase fitness then genes causing teeth to be sharp will increase in frequency.</i>
furnishing	The act of providing a house or room with furniture and other removable items such as shelves, carpets, appliances, etc. <i>The furnishing comprised three easy chairs and one oval table.</i>
<u>furniture</u>	Pieces of wood or metal placed round or between metal type to make blank spaces and fasten the type in the chase. <i>They had too much furniture for the small apartment.</i>
gymnasium	Athletic facility equipped for sports or physical training.
in	Of the tide rising or at its highest level. <i>The in basket.</i>
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>An indoor setting.</i>
inside	Situated on or in the inside. <i>Overtaking on the inside.</i>
interior	The inner part of something; the inside. <i>Interior regions of the earth.</i>
<u>internal</u>	Of the inner nature of a thing; intrinsic. <i>The tube had an internal diameter of 1 1 mm.</i>
intramural	Carried on within the bounds of an institution or community. <i>Most of the students participated actively in the college s intramural sports program.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical size of a computer.</i>
proscenium	The stage of an ancient theatre.
<u>regimen</u>	(medicine) a systematic plan for therapy (often including diet). <i>A regimen of one or two injections per day.</i>
<u>school</u>	The process of being formally educated at a school. <i>He schooled her in horsemanship.</i>
seat	Of a vehicle or building have seats for a specified number of people. <i>He lost his seat in the 1997 election.</i>

sofa

An upholstered seat for more than one person.

***Sofa** cushions.*

sport

Someone who engages in sports.

*He was **sporting** a huge handlebar moustache.*

stamina

The ability to sustain prolonged physical or mental effort.

*Their secret is **stamina** rather than speed.*

theater

A region in which active military operations are in progress.

*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*

wellness

The state of being in good health, especially as an actively pursued goal.

*Company health and **wellness** programmes.*
