<b>acquire</b>	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality). <i>I ve <b>acquired</b> a taste for whisky.</i>
<b>achievement</b>	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The <b>achievement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>approbation</b>	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>attainable</b>	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily <b>attainable</b>.</i>
<b>belong</b>	Be rightly assigned to a specified category. <i>You and me we <b>belong</b> together.</i>
<b>checkbook</b>	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win <b>earned</b> them 50 000 in prize money.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>Kind offers <b>fetched</b> tears from me.</i>
<b>grab</b>	Attract the attention of; make an impression on. <i>How does that <b>grab</b> you.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Have or hold in one s hands or grip. <i>She can <b>hold</b> an audience spellbound.</i>
<b>holder</b>	A smallholder. <i>The FA Cup <b>holders</b>.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>Your <b>host</b> is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
<b>incur</b>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses <b>incurred</b>.</i>
<b>landlady</b>	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.
<b>landlord</b>	A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

<b>let</b>	A period during which a room or property is rented. <i>They've <b>let</b> out their house.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you <b>obtain</b> the visa.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>Do your <b>own</b> thing.</i>
<b>owner</b>	A person who owns something. <i>The proud <b>owner</b> of a huge Dalmatian.</i>
<b>permission</b>	An official document giving authorization. <i>He received <b>permission</b> to go to Brussels.</i>
<b>possess</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>A fading blonde <b>possessed</b> of a powerful soprano voice.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The state of being completely dominated by an idea or emotion. <i>Fear took <b>possession</b> of my soul.</i>
<b>possessor</b>	A person who owns something. <i>His father was the <b>possessor</b> of a considerable fortune.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He haunted railway stations to <b>procure</b> young girls for immoral purposes.</i>
<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>The stolen <b>property</b> was not recovered.</i>
<b>proprietor</b>	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant <b>proprietors</b>.</i>
<b>regain</b>	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>They were unable to <b>regain</b> their boats.</i>
<b>rent</b>	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>We <b>rented</b> our apartment to friends while we were abroad.</i>
<b>retention</b>	The act of retaining something. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid <b>retention</b>.</i>
<b>take</b>	Be designed to hold or take. <i>Add the numbers together and <b>take</b> away five.</i>
