| incur | Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i> |
| landlady | A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub. |
| landlord | A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub. |

| obtain | Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i> |
| own | Have ownership or possession of. <i>Do your own thing.</i> |
| owner | A person who owns something. <i>The proud owner of a huge Dalmatian.</i> |
| permission | An official document giving authorization. <i>He received permission to go to Brussels.</i> |
| possess | Have ownership or possession of. <i>A fading blonde possessed of a powerful soprano voice.</i> |
| possession | The state of being completely dominated by an idea or emotion. <i>Fear took possession of my soul.</i> |
| possessor | A person who owns something. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i> |
| procure | Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He haunted railway stations to procure young girls for immoral purposes.</i> |
| property | Shares or investments in property. <i>The stolen property was not recovered.</i> |
| proprietor | Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant proprietors.</i> |
| regain | Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>They were unable to regain their boats.</i> |
| rent | Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>We rented our apartment to friends while we were abroad.</i> |
| retention | The act of retaining something. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid retention.</i> |
| take | Be designed to hold or take. <i>Add the numbers together and take away five.</i> |
