acquire	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality). <i>I ve acquired a taste for whisky.</i>
achievement	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The achievement of self control.</i>
approbation	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
attainable	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily attainable.</i>
belong	Be rightly assigned to a specified category. <i>You and me we belong together.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win earned them 50 000 in prize money.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>Kind offers fetched tears from me.</i>
grab	Attract the attention of; make an impression on. <i>How does that grab you.</i>
hold	Have or hold in one s hands or grip. <i>She can hold an audience spellbound.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>The FA Cup holders.</i>
host	Be the host of or for. <i>Your host is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
incur	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>
landlady	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.
landlord	A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

let	A period during which a room or property is rented. <i>They've let out their house.</i>
obtain	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i>
own	Have ownership or possession of. <i>Do your own thing.</i>
owner	A person who owns something. <i>The proud owner of a huge Dalmatian.</i>
permission	An official document giving authorization. <i>He received permission to go to Brussels.</i>
possess	Have ownership or possession of. <i>A fading blonde possessed of a powerful soprano voice.</i>
possession	The state of being completely dominated by an idea or emotion. <i>Fear took possession of my soul.</i>
possessor	A person who owns something. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>
procure	Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He haunted railway stations to procure young girls for immoral purposes.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>The stolen property was not recovered.</i>
proprietor	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant proprietors.</i>
regain	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>They were unable to regain their boats.</i>
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>We rented our apartment to friends while we were abroad.</i>
retention	The act of retaining something. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid retention.</i>
take	Be designed to hold or take. <i>Add the numbers together and take away five.</i>
