beau	A boyfriend or male admirer.
buddy	A working companion with whom close cooperation is required. <i>I m working on it buddy.</i>
colleague	An associate that one works with. <i>The surgeon consulted his colleagues.</i>
companion	Be a companion to somebody. <i>My companions in misfortune.</i>
companionship	A feeling of fellowship or friendship. <i>The love and companionship of marriage.</i>
compatriot	A fellow citizen or national of a country. <i>Stich defeated his compatriot Boris Becker in the quarter finals.</i>
comrade	(among men) a colleague or a fellow member of an organization. <i>Greetings comrade.</i>
comradeship	The company and friendship of others with common aims. <i>His greatest joy came from comradeship with others in the team.</i>
conjugal	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Conjugal loyalty.</i>
connubial	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple; conjugal. <i>Their connubial bed.</i>
cordiality	A cordial disposition.
countryman	A person from the same country as someone else. <i>He was a complete countryman with a pronounced affinity with nature.</i>
dandy	Relating to or characteristic of a dandy. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a dandy.</i>

<u>darling</u>	Beloved. <i>His darling wife.</i>
<u>dear</u>	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>One s dearest wish.</i>
ex	The 24th letter of the Roman alphabet. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
folk	Relating to folk music. <i>An old folks home.</i>
friend	Befriend someone. <i>We are friends of the family.</i>
<u>friendship</u>	The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends. <i>Because of the friendship between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<u>husband</u>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She husbanded their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
lad	A young man who is boisterously macho. <i>A furious row ensued between the referee and our lads.</i>
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>My best mate Steve.</i>
<u>paramour</u>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<u>partner</u>	Associate or work together as partners. <i>We ve partnered with several venues and organizations to bring fun science events to the city.</i>
<u>peer</u>	A nobleman duke or marquis or earl or viscount or baron who is a member of the British peerage. <i>Faye peered at her with suspicion.</i>
philander	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Married men who philander.</i>
platonic	(of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual. <i>Their relationship is purely platonic.</i>
sisterhood	The kinship relation between a female offspring and the siblings. <i>Canadian feminists acknowledge their sisterhood with women around the globe.</i>
workmate	A person with whom one works.
