## Associations of "Hail fellow well met" (30 Words)

<b>beau</b>	A boyfriend or male admirer.
<b>buddy</b>	A working companion with whom close cooperation is required. <i>I m working on it <b>buddy</b>.</i>
<b>colleague</b>	An associate that one works with. <i>The surgeon consulted his <b>colleagues</b>.</i>
<b>companion</b>	Be a companion to somebody. <i>My <b>companions</b> in misfortune.</i>
<b>companionship</b>	A feeling of fellowship or friendship. <i>The love and <b>companionship</b> of marriage.</i>
<b>compatriot</b>	A fellow citizen or national of a country. <i>Stich defeated his <b>compatriot</b> Boris Becker in the quarter finals.</i>
<b>comrade</b>	(among men) a colleague or a fellow member of an organization. <i>Greetings <b>comrade</b>.</i>
<b>comradeship</b>	The company and friendship of others with common aims. <i>His greatest joy came from <b>comradeship</b> with others in the team.</i>
<b>conjugal</b>	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i><b>Conjugal</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>connubial</b>	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple; conjugal. <i>Their <b>connubial</b> bed.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b>countryman</b>	A person from the same country as someone else. <i>He was a complete <b>countryman</b> with a pronounced affinity with nature.</i>
<b>dandy</b>	Relating to or characteristic of a dandy. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a <b>dandy</b>.</i>

<b><u>darling</u></b>	Beloved. <i>His <b>darling</b> wife.</i>
<b><u>dear</u></b>	A beloved person used as terms of endearment. <i>One s <b>dearest</b> wish.</i>
<b>ex</b>	The 24th letter of the Roman alphabet. <i>All his <b>exes</b> live in <b>Texas</b>.</i>
<b>folk</b>	Relating to folk music. <i>An old <b>folks</b> home.</i>
<b>friend</b>	Befriend someone. <i>We are <b>friends</b> of the family.</i>
<b><u>friendship</u></b>	The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends. <i>Because of the <b>friendship</b> between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<b><u>husband</u></b>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She <b>husbanded</b> their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b>lad</b>	A young man who is boisterously macho. <i>A furious row ensued between the referee and our <b>lads</b>.</i>
<b>mate</b>	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>My best <b>mate</b> Steve.</i>
<b><u>paramour</u></b>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<b><u>partner</u></b>	Associate or work together as partners. <i>We ve <b>partnered</b> with several venues and organizations to bring fun science events to the city.</i>
<b><u>peer</u></b>	A nobleman duke or marquis or earl or viscount or baron who is a member of the British peerage. <i>Faye <b>peered</b> at her with suspicion.</i>
<b>philander</b>	Talk or behave amorously, without serious intentions. <i>Married men who <b>philander</b>.</i>
<b>platonic</b>	(of love or friendship) intimate and affectionate but not sexual. <i>Their relationship is purely <b>platonic</b>.</i>
<b>sisterhood</b>	The kinship relation between a female offspring and the siblings. <i>Canadian feminists acknowledge their <b>sisterhood</b> with women around the globe.</i>
<b>workmate</b>	A person with whom one works.
