
### Half as a Noun

- Either of two equal periods of time into which a sports game or a performance is divided.
- One of two divisions into which some games or performances are divided: the two divisions are separated by an interval.
- A score for an individual hole that is the same as one's opponent's.
- Either of two equal or corresponding parts into which something is or can be divided.
- A half-price fare or ticket, especially for a child.
- Half a pint of beer or a similar drink.
- One of two equal parts of a divisible whole.

in part	To or toward the inside of.
in some measure	To or toward the inside of.
inadequately	In a way that lacks the quality or quantity required; unsatisfactorily. <i>A hastily trained <b>inadequately</b> equipped army.</i>
incompletely	In an partial or unfinished manner. Incompletely digested food.
insufficiently	To an inadequate degree; not enough. <i>We were <b>insufficiently</b> attentive.</i>
part	In part in some degree not wholly. I felt <b>part</b> ly to blame.
<b>partially</b>	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>He was <b>partially</b> paralyzed.</i>



partly	In part; in some degree; not wholly. You re only <b>partly</b> right.
<u>slightly</u>	In a slim or slender manner. <b>Slightly</b> built.
to some degree	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
to some extent	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
up to a point	Nearer to the speaker.

- I am half inclined to believe you.

alliterate	(of a phrase or line of verse) contain words which begin with the same sound or letter. <i>His first and last names <b>alliterate</b>d</i> .
alliteration	The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words. The <b>alliteration</b> of sweet birds sang.
antiquated	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. This <b>antiquated</b> central heating system.
<u>century</u>	A period of a hundred years reckoned from the traditional date of the birth of Christ. A <i>century</i> ago most people walked to work.
<u>decade</u>	A period of ten years. He taught at the university for nearly a <b>decade</b> .



The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. She has <b>dozen</b> s of admirers.
A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. A <b>few</b> weeks ago.
Constituting or comprising a part or fraction of a possible whole or entirety. <i>Fractional crystallization</i> .
Consisting of small disconnected parts. Excavations have revealed <b>fragmentary</b> remains of masonry.
Ten 10s. Wantage <b>Hundred</b> .
Not complete or total; not completed. An <b>incomplete</b> forward pass.
Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. The garter snake is the <b>least</b> dangerous snake.
Used to form the comparative of some adjectives and adverbs. <i>Less</i> interesting.
(in England and Wales) a unit of land, originally a feudal lordship, consisting of a lord's demesne and lands rented to tenants. <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their manor.</i>
A part or portion, especially a lesser share. The enzyme removes the sulphate <b>moiety</b> .
Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. The person most <b>nearly</b> concerned.
One of four playing cards in a deck with nine pips on the face.
The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one s duty. The business <b>part</b> ners broke over a tax question.
A harmonic with a frequency that is a multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>The paper gave a distorted and very</i> <b><i>partial</i></b> <i>view of the situation.</i>
Only in part; to a limited extent. A <b>partially</b> open door.
Something less than the whole of a human artifact. A <b>portion</b> of ice cream.
Divide into quarters. Edward III <b>quarter</b> ed the French royal arms with his own.

semi	A semi final. She pulled into the path of a <b>semi</b> .
<u>sketchy</u>	Not thorough or detailed. Details of the plan remain <b>sketchy</b> .
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>He needs feeding up <b>some</b>.</i>
ten	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
<u>total</u>	Add up in number or quantity. <i>He almost <b>total</b>led the car.</i>
twelve	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.
unfinished	(of an object) not having been given an attractive surface appearance as the final stage of manufacture. <i>The building is still <b>unfinished</b>.</i>
