- *Either of two equal periods of time into which a sports game or a performance is divided.*
- *One of two divisions into which some games or performances are divided: the two divisions are separated by an interval.*
- *A score for an individual hole that is the same as one's opponent's.*
- *Either of two equal or corresponding parts into which something is or can be divided.*
- *A half-price fare or ticket, especially for a child.*
- *Half a pint of beer or a similar drink.*
- *One of two equal parts of a divisible whole.*

one-half One of two equal parts of a divisible whole.

Synonyms of "Half" as an adverb (13 Words)

barely	Almost not. <i>The network has barely 5 percent of viewers.</i>
in part	To or toward the inside of.
in some measure	To or toward the inside of.
inadequately	In a way that lacks the quality or quantity required; unsatisfactorily. <i>A hastily trained inadequately equipped army.</i>
incompletely	In an partial or unfinished manner. <i>Incompletely digested food.</i>
insufficiently	To an inadequate degree; not enough. <i>We were insufficiently attentive.</i>
part	In part in some degree not wholly. <i>I felt partly to blame.</i>
partially	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>He was partially paralyzed.</i>

partly	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>You re only partly right.</i>
slightly	In a slim or slender manner. <i>Slightly built.</i>
to some degree	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
to some extent	Imprecise but fairly close to correct.
up to a point	Nearer to the speaker.



Usage Examples of "Half" as an adverb

- *The glass was half full.*
- *The chicken is half-cooked.*
- *I am half inclined to believe you.*



Associations of "Half" (30 Words)

- alliterate** (of a phrase or line of verse) contain words which begin with the same sound or letter.
*His first and last names **alliterated**.*
- alliteration** The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words.
*The **alliteration** of sweet birds sang.*
- antiquated** So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period.
*This **antiquated** central heating system.*
- century** A period of a hundred years reckoned from the traditional date of the birth of Christ.
*A **century** ago most people walked to work.*
- decade** A period of ten years.
*He taught at the university for nearly a **decade**.*

dozen	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. <i>She has dozens of admirers.</i>
few	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by 'a'; a small but indefinite number. <i>A few weeks ago.</i>
fractional	Constituting or comprising a part or fraction of a possible whole or entirety. <i>Fractional crystallization.</i>
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i>
hundred	Ten 10s. <i>Wantage Hundred.</i>
incomplete	Not complete or total; not completed. <i>An incomplete forward pass.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>The garter snake is the least dangerous snake.</i>
less	Used to form the comparative of some adjectives and adverbs. <i>Less interesting.</i>
manor	(in England and Wales) a unit of land, originally a feudal lordship, consisting of a lord's demesne and lands rented to tenants. <i>They were the undisputed rulers of their manor.</i>
moiety	A part or portion, especially a lesser share. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
nearly	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>The person most nearly concerned.</i>
nine	One of four playing cards in a deck with nine pips on the face.
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>The business partners broke over a tax question.</i>
partial	A harmonic with a frequency that is a multiple of the fundamental frequency. <i>The paper gave a distorted and very partial view of the situation.</i>
partially	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>A partially open door.</i>
portion	Something less than the whole of a human artifact. <i>A portion of ice cream.</i>
quarter	Divide into quarters. <i>Edward III quartered the French royal arms with his own.</i>

- section** Commit someone compulsorily to a psychiatric hospital in accordance with a section of a mental health act.
*No **section** of the nation is more ardent than the South.*
- semi** A semi final.
*She pulled into the path of a **semi**.*
- sketchy** Not thorough or detailed.
*Details of the plan remain **sketchy**.*
- some** To some extent quite a lot.
*He needs feeding up **some**.*
- ten** One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
- total** Add up in number or quantity.
*He almost **totalled** the car.*
- twelve** The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.
- unfinished** (of an object) not having been given an attractive surface appearance as the final stage of manufacture.
*The building is still **unfinished**.*
