assay-mark	A mark on an article of trade to indicate its origin and authenticity.
authentication	The process or action of proving or showing something to be true, genuine, or valid. <i>User authentication for each device ensures that the individual using the device is recognized by the company.</i>
authentication mark	The impression created by doing something unusual or extraordinary that people notice and remember.
earmark	A distinctive characteristic or attribute. <i>This car has all the earmarks of a classic.</i>
indication	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>The visit was an indication of the improvement in relations between the countries.</i>
indicator	An animal or plant species that can be used to infer conditions in a particular habitat. <i>The indicator board.</i>
mark	A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score. <i>His arrow hit the mark.</i>
official mark	A worker who holds or is invested with an office.
sign	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified de Saussure. <i>He observed signs and miracles taking place.</i>
stamp of authentication	Machine consisting of a heavy bar that moves vertically for pounding or crushing ores.
stamp of authenticity	A small piece of adhesive paper that is put on an object to show that a government tax has been paid.
stylemark	A distinctive characteristic or attribute.
telltale sign	Someone who gossips indiscreetly.
<u>trademark</u>	A distinctive characteristic or object. <i>The murder had all the trademarks of a Mafia hit.</i>

blemish	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>My main problem was a blemished skin.</i>
blot	Transfer by means of a blot. <i>A dust shield blotting out the sun.</i>
blotch	Cover with blotches. <i>Her face was blotched and swollen with crying.</i>
discolour	Change color, often in an undesired manner. <i>Too much aluminium can discolour water.</i>
smear	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>Smear the wall with paint.</i>
smudge	Make a smudge on soil by smudging. <i>Mascaras that smudge or flake around the eyes.</i>
stain	Produce or leave stains. <i>People knew how to stain glass a beautiful blue in the middle ages.</i>
streak	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>The plane streaked across the sky.</i>

<u>idiosyncratic</u>	Relating to idiosyncrasy; peculiar or individual. <i>We all have our own idiosyncratic gestures.</i>
individualism	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>Encouragement has been given to individualism free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
<u>individuality</u>	Individual characteristics. <i>So absorbed by the movement that she lost all sense of individuality.</i>

individuate	Distinguish from others of the same kind; single out. <i>Language that individuates his memories.</i>
juncture	A particular point in events or time. <i>It is difficult to say at this juncture whether this upturn can be sustained.</i>
particular	Unique or specific to a person or thing or category. <i>A particular description of the room.</i>
<u>precise</u>	Sharply exact or accurate or delimited. <i>The director was precise with his camera positions.</i>
salience	The quality of being particularly noticeable or important; prominence. <i>The political salience of religion has a considerable impact.</i>
<u>singular</u>	A singular word or form. <i>A singular example.</i>
singularly	In a strange or eccentric way. <i>You have singularly failed to live up to your promises.</i>
special	A special offering usually temporary and at a reduced price that is featured in advertising. <i>We want to preserve our town s special character.</i>
specialization	(biology) the structural adaptation of some body part for a particular function. <i>The way different muscles are constructed allows for specialization of function.</i>
<u>specific</u>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>The differences between them can only be on the specific level.</i>
<u>trademark</u>	Mark with a brand or trademark. <i>The company trademarked their new gadget.</i>
uncommon	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>He was uncommon afraid.</i>
unique	A unique person or thing. <i>Some of Lamb s writings were so memorably beautiful as to be uniques in their class.</i>
