<b>authentication</b>	The process or action of proving or showing something to be true, genuine, or valid. <i>User <b>authentication</b> for each device ensures that the individual using the device is recognized by the company.</i>
<b>authentication mark</b>	The impression created by doing something unusual or extraordinary that people notice and remember.
<b>earmark</b>	A distinctive characteristic or attribute. <i>This car has all the <b>earmarks</b> of a classic.</i>
<b>indication</b>	Something that serves to indicate or suggest. <i>The visit was an <b>indication</b> of the improvement in relations between the countries.</i>
<b>indicator</b>	An animal or plant species that can be used to infer conditions in a particular habitat. <i>The <b>indicator</b> board.</i>
<b>mark</b>	A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score. <i>His arrow hit the <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>official mark</b>	A worker who holds or is invested with an office.
<b>sign</b>	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified de Saussure. <i>He observed <b>signs</b> and miracles taking place.</i>
<b>stamp of authentication</b>	Machine consisting of a heavy bar that moves vertically for pounding or crushing ores.
<b>stamp of authenticity</b>	A small piece of adhesive paper that is put on an object to show that a government tax has been paid.
<b>stylemark</b>	A distinctive characteristic or attribute.
<b>telltale sign</b>	Someone who gossips indiscreetly.
<b><u>trademark</u></b>	A distinctive characteristic or object. <i>The murder had all the <b>trademarks</b> of a Mafia hit.</i>

### Synonyms of "Hallmark" as a verb (8 Words)

<b>blemish</b>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>My main problem was a <b>blemished</b> skin.</i>
<b>blot</b>	Transfer by means of a blot. <i>A dust shield <b>blotting</b> out the sun.</i>
<b>blotch</b>	Cover with blotches. <i>Her face was <b>blotched</b> and swollen with crying.</i>
<b>discolour</b>	Change color, often in an undesired manner. <i>Too much aluminium can <b>discolour</b> water.</i>
<b>smear</b>	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i><b>Smear</b> the wall with paint.</i>
<b>smudge</b>	Make a smudge on soil by smudging. <i>Mascaras that <b>smudge</b> or flake around the eyes.</i>
<b>stain</b>	Produce or leave stains. <i>People knew how to <b>stain</b> glass a beautiful blue in the middle ages.</i>
<b>streak</b>	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>The plane <b>streaked</b> across the sky.</i>

<b>distinctive</b>	Of a feature that helps to distinguish a person or thing- Curtis Wilkie. <i>Jerusalem has a <b>distinctive</b> Middle East flavor.</i>
<b>emphasis</b>	The relative prominence of a syllable or musical note (especially with regard to stress or pitch). <i>He spoke with <b>emphasis</b> and with complete conviction.</i>
<b>especial</b>	Better or greater than usual; special. <i>He paid <b>especial</b> attention to her.</i>
<b>especially</b>	To a great extent; very much. <i>A new song written <b>especially</b> for Jonathan.</i>
<b>feature</b>	Have as a feature. <i>An expression of pleasure crossed his <b>features</b>.</i>
<b>featured</b>	Having facial features as specified; usually used in combination. <i>The complexities of a fully <b>featured</b> computer.</i>
<b>idiosyncrasy</b>	An abnormal physical reaction by an individual to a food or drug. <i>One of his little <b>idiosyncrasies</b> was always preferring to be in the car first.</i>
<b>idiosyncratic</b>	Relating to idiosyncrasy; peculiar or individual. <i>We all have our own <b>idiosyncratic</b> gestures.</i>
<b>individualism</b>	The habit or principle of being independent and self-reliant. <i>Encouragement has been given to <b>individualism</b> free enterprise and the pursuit of profit.</i>
<b>individuality</b>	Individual characteristics. <i>So absorbed by the movement that she lost all sense of <b>individuality</b>.</i>

<b>individuate</b>	Distinguish from others of the same kind; single out. <i>Language that <b>individuates</b> his memories.</i>
<b>juncture</b>	A particular point in events or time. <i>It is difficult to say at this <b>juncture</b> whether this upturn can be sustained.</i>
<b>particular</b>	Unique or specific to a person or thing or category. <i>A <b>particular</b> description of the room.</i>
<b>precise</b>	Sharply exact or accurate or delimited. <i>The director was <b>precise</b> with his camera positions.</i>
<b>salience</b>	The quality of being particularly noticeable or important; prominence. <i>The political <b>salience</b> of religion has a considerable impact.</i>
<b>singular</b>	A singular word or form. <i>A <b>singular</b> example.</i>
<b>singularly</b>	In a strange or eccentric way. <i>You have <b>singularly</b> failed to live up to your promises.</i>
<b>special</b>	A special offering usually temporary and at a reduced price that is featured in advertising. <i>We want to preserve our town s <b>special</b> character.</i>
<b>specialization</b>	(biology) the structural adaptation of some body part for a particular function. <i>The way different muscles are constructed allows for <b>specialization</b> of function.</i>
<b>specific</b>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>The differences between them can only be on the <b>specific</b> level.</i>
<b>trademark</b>	Mark with a brand or trademark. <i>The company <b>trademarked</b> their new gadget.</i>
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>He was <b>uncommon</b> afraid.</i>
<b>unique</b>	A unique person or thing. <i>Some of Lamb s writings were so memorably beautiful as to be <b>uniques</b> in their class.</i>
