paranoiac The violent defensiveness of the **paranoiac** is directed against all who

challenge his power.

paranoid A person who is paranoid.

Paranoid schizophrenia.

A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired

A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal
