## Hallucination as a Noun

### Definitions of "Hallucination" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “hallucination” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A mistaken or unfounded opinion or idea.*
- *An object perceived during a hallucinatory episode.*
- *An experience involving the apparent perception of something not present.*
- *Illusory perception; a common symptom of severe mental disorder.*



## Synonyms of "Hallucination" as a noun (10 Words)

- apparition** An act of appearing or becoming visible unexpectedly.  
*I was recalled to the present by the **apparition** of a frightening specter.*
- chimera** (in Greek mythology) a fire-breathing female monster with a lion's head, a goat's body, and a serpent's tail.  
*The economic sovereignty you claim to defend is a **chimera**.*
- daydream** A series of pleasant thoughts that distract one's attention from the present.  
*She was lost in a **daydream**.*
- delusion** The act of deluding; deception by creating illusory ideas.  
*He has **delusions** of competence.*



**dream**

A state of mind characterized by abstraction and release from reality.  
*Her new man s an absolute **dream**.*

**fantasy**

A fanciful mental image, typically one on which a person often dwells and which reflects their conscious or unconscious wishes.  
*It is a misleading **fantasy** to suggest that the bill can be implemented.*

**figment of the imagination**

A contrived or fantastic idea.

**illusion**

A false idea or belief.

*They have the **illusion** that I am very wealthy.*

**mirage**

An optical illusion caused by atmospheric conditions, especially the appearance of a sheet of water in a desert or on a hot road caused by the refraction of light from the sky by heated air.

*The surface of the road ahead rippled in the heat **mirages**.*

**vision**

The images seen on a television screen.

*The runners emerged from the trees into his clear **vision**.*



## Usage Examples of "Hallucination" as a noun

- *He refused to believe that the angel was a hallucination.*
- *His dreams of vast wealth are a hallucination.*
- *He continued to suffer from horrific hallucinations.*



## Associations of "Hallucination" (30 Words)

- agitation** A state of agitation or turbulent change or development.  
*She was wringing her hands in **agitation**.*
- amnesia** Partial or total loss of memory.  
*They were suffering from **amnesia**.*
- bewilderment** A feeling of being perplexed and confused.  
*There was **bewilderment** at the shift of government policy.*
- bipolar** Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder.  
*A sharply **bipolar** division of affluent and underclass.*

<b>chimerical</b>	Being or relating to or like a chimera- Douglas Bush. <i>His Utopia is not a <b>chimerical</b> commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.</i>
<b>confusion</b>	An act causing a disorderly combination of elements with identities lost and distinctions blended. <i>The army retreated in <b>confusion</b>.</i>
<b><u>delusion</u></b>	An erroneous belief that is held in the face of evidence to the contrary. <i>He has <b>delusions</b> of competence.</i>
<b>dementia</b>	A chronic or persistent disorder of the mental processes caused by brain disease or injury and marked by memory disorders, personality changes, and impaired reasoning.
<b><u>disarray</u></b>	A mental state characterized by a lack of clear and orderly thought and behavior. <i>Her grey hair was in <b>disarray</b>.</i>
<b>disorder</b>	Bring disorder to. <i>Recurrent food crises led to outbreaks of <b>disorder</b>.</i>
<b><u>dream</u></b>	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>He <b>dreamt</b> a strange scene.</i>
<b>excitement</b>	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>His face was flushed with <b>excitement</b> and his hands trembled.</i>
<b><u>fantasy</u></b>	Something many people believe that is false. <i>His researches had moved into the realms of <b>fantasy</b>.</i>
<b>forgetfulness</b>	Lapse of memory. <i>His <b>forgetfulness</b> increased as he grew older.</i>
<b>hallucinatory</b>	Characterized by or characteristic of hallucination. <i>A <b>hallucinatory</b> drug.</i>
<b>illusion</b>	The act of deluding; deception by creating illusory ideas. <i>He had no <b>illusions</b> about the trouble she was in.</i>
<b><u>imagination</u></b>	The part of the mind that imagines things. <i><b>Imagination</b> reveals what the world could be.</i>
<b>indecision</b>	Doubt concerning two or more possible alternatives or courses of action. <i>Government <b>indecision</b> over the future of local taxation.</i>
<b><u>insane</u></b>	Shocking; outrageous. <i><b>Insane</b> laughter.</i>
<b>mania</b>	Mental illness marked by periods of great excitement or euphoria, delusions, and overactivity. <i>Many people suffering from <b>mania</b> do not think anything is wrong.</i>

<b>megalomania</b>	Delusion about one's own power or importance (typically as a symptom of manic or paranoid disorder).
<b>mystification</b>	Confusion resulting from failure to understand.
<b>neurosis</b>	A mental or personality disturbance not attributable to any known neurological or organic dysfunction. <i>Freud's two stage account of <b>neurosis</b>.</i>
<b>oblivion</b>	Total forgetfulness. <i>His name will fade into <b>oblivion</b>.</i>
<b>paranoia</b>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
<b>paranoiac</b>	A person afflicted with paranoia. <i>The violent defensiveness of the <b>paranoiac</b> is directed against all who challenge his power.</i>
<b>paranoid</b>	A person who is paranoid. <i><b>Paranoid</b> schizophrenia.</i>
<b>psychosis</b>	A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality. <i>The symptoms of <b>psychosis</b>.</i>
<b>schizophrenia</b>	A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation. <i>Gibraltar's <b>schizophrenia</b> continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
<b>surreal</b>	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>The incongruous imagery in <b>surreal</b> art and literature.</i>
