abolitionism	The doctrine that calls for the abolition of slavery.
airsickness	Motion sickness experienced while traveling by air (especially during turbulence.

blockade	Impose a blockade on. The authorities <b>blockade</b> d roads in and out of the capital.
circumvention	The act of evading by going around. <b>Circumvention</b> of the rules undermines any fairness.
<u>deter</u>	Try to prevent; show opposition to. Strategists think not only about how to <b>deter</b> war but about how war might occur.
dislodgement	Forced removal from a position of advantage.
embarrass	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. She wouldn t <b>embarrass</b> either of them by making a scene.
fetter	Restrain with fetters. He was not <b>fetter</b> ed by tradition.
firewall	Protect a network or system from unauthorized access with a firewall. <i>Our security products offer integral firewall</i> ing.
<u>forbid</u>	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. The cliffs <b>forbid</b> any easy turning movement.
foreclose	Subject to foreclosing procedures; take away the right of mortgagors to redeem their mortgage. The bank was threatening to <b>foreclose</b> on his mortgage.
forestall	Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time. <i>He would have spoken but David <b>forestall</b>ed him.</i>



forfend	Avert or prevent (something evil or unpleasant. The sacrifice of Mississippi was <b>forfend</b> ed against even the treason of Wilkinson.
fungicide	Any agent that destroys or prevents the growth of fungi. <i>Cut away any rotten parts before dusting with</i> <b>fungicide</b> .
<u>hack</u>	An act of computer hacking. I was waking up in the middle of the night and coughing and <b>hack</b> ing for hours.
hinder	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The <b>hinder</b> part of a carcass.</i>
illegalize	Declare illegal; outlaw.
impede	Block passage through. The sap causes swelling which can <b>impede</b> breathing.
inhibit	Make (someone) self-conscious and as a result unable to act naturally. <i>His father s cold and distant demeanor</i> <b>inhibit</b> ed him emotionally.
insulate	Make (land) into an island. The room was heavily <b>insulate</b> d against all outside noise.
nag	A person who nags someone. She <b>nag</b> ged to take a vacation.
obstruct	Commit the offence of intentionally hindering (a police officer. An indirect free kick is awarded for intentionally <b>obstruct</b> ing an opponent.
occlude	Cover (an eye) to prevent its use. <i>Occlude</i> d within these crystals are other molecules.
<u>preclude</u>	Prevent from happening; make impossible. <i>Your role in the projects <b>preclude</b>s your involvement in the competitive project.</i>
prevent	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. Action must be taken to <b>prevent</b> further accidents.
shackle	Chain with shackles. The prisoner was <b>shackle</b> d to the heavy steel chair in the centre of the room.
stonewall	Delay or obstruct (a request, process, or person) by refusing to answer questions or by being evasive. I have repeatedly given him the opportunity to clear this matter up but the estate has met with <b>stonewall</b> after <b>stonewall</b> .
<u>stymie</u>	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The changes must not be allowed to <b>stymie</b> new medical treatments.</i>
