## Associations of "Hampered" (30 Words)

<b>abolitionism</b>	The doctrine that calls for the abolition of slavery.
<b>airsickness</b>	Motion sickness experienced while traveling by air (especially during turbulence).
<a href="#"><b>avert</b></a>	Turn away (one's eyes or thoughts). <i><b>Avert</b> a strike.</i>
<b>blockade</b>	Impose a blockade on. <i>The authorities <b>blockaded</b> roads in and out of the capital.</i>
<b>circumvention</b>	The act of evading by going around. <i><b>Circumvention</b> of the rules undermines any fairness.</i>
<a href="#"><b>deter</b></a>	Try to prevent; show opposition to. <i>Strategists think not only about how to <b>deter</b> war but about how war might occur.</i>
<b>dislodgement</b>	Forced removal from a position of advantage.
<b>embarrass</b>	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. <i>She wouldn't <b>embarrass</b> either of them by making a scene.</i>
<b>fetter</b>	Restrain with fetters. <i>He was not <b>fettered</b> by tradition.</i>
<b>firewall</b>	Protect a network or system from unauthorized access with a firewall. <i>Our security products offer integral <b>firewalling</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>forbid</b></a>	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. <i>The cliffs <b>forbid</b> any easy turning movement.</i>
<b>foreclose</b>	Subject to foreclosing procedures; take away the right of mortgagors to redeem their mortgage. <i>The bank was threatening to <b>foreclose</b> on his mortgage.</i>
<b>forestall</b>	Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time. <i>He would have spoken but David <b>forestalled</b> him.</i>

<b>forfend</b>	Avert or prevent (something evil or unpleasant). <i>The sacrifice of Mississippi was <b>forfended</b> against even the treason of Wilkinson.</i>
<b>fungicide</b>	Any agent that destroys or prevents the growth of fungi. <i>Cut away any rotten parts before dusting with <b>fungicide</b>.</i>
<b>hack</b>	An act of computer hacking. <i>I was waking up in the middle of the night and coughing and <b>hacking</b> for hours.</i>
<b>hinder</b>	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The <b>hinder</b> part of a carcass.</i>
<b>illegalize</b>	Declare illegal; outlaw.
<b>impede</b>	Block passage through. <i>The sap causes swelling which can <b>impede</b> breathing.</i>
<b>inhibit</b>	Make (someone) self-conscious and as a result unable to act naturally. <i>His father's cold and distant demeanor <b>inhibited</b> him emotionally.</i>
<b>insulate</b>	Make (land) into an island. <i>The room was heavily <b>insulated</b> against all outside noise.</i>
<b>nag</b>	A person who nags someone. <i>She <b>nagged</b> to take a vacation.</i>
<b>obstruct</b>	Commit the offence of intentionally hindering (a police officer). <i>An indirect free kick is awarded for intentionally <b>obstructing</b> an opponent.</i>
<b>occlude</b>	Cover (an eye) to prevent its use. <i><b>Occluded</b> within these crystals are other molecules.</i>
<b>preclude</b>	Prevent from happening; make impossible. <i>Your role in the projects <b>precludes</b> your involvement in the competitive project.</i>
<b>prevent</b>	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. <i>Action must be taken to <b>prevent</b> further accidents.</i>
<b>shackle</b>	Chain with shackles. <i>The prisoner was <b>shackled</b> to the heavy steel chair in the centre of the room.</i>
<b>stonewall</b>	Delay or obstruct (a request, process, or person) by refusing to answer questions or by being evasive. <i>I have repeatedly given him the opportunity to clear this matter up but the estate has met with <b>stonewall</b> after <b>stonewall</b>.</i>
<b>stymie</b>	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The changes must not be allowed to <b>stymie</b> new medical treatments.</i>
