abolitionism	The doctrine that calls for the abolition of slavery.
airsickness	Motion sickness experienced while traveling by air (especially during turbulence).
avert	Turn away (one’s eyes or thoughts). <i>Avert a strike.</i>
blockade	Impose a blockade on. <i>The authorities blockaded roads in and out of the capital.</i>
circumvention	The act of evading by going around. <i>Circumvention of the rules undermines any fairness.</i>
deter	Try to prevent; show opposition to. <i>Strategists think not only about how to deter war but about how war might occur.</i>
dislodgement	Forced removal from a position of advantage.
embarrass	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. <i>She wouldn't embarrass either of them by making a scene.</i>
fetter	Restrain with fetters. <i>He was not fettered by tradition.</i>
firewall	Protect a network or system from unauthorized access with a firewall. <i>Our security products offer integral firewalling.</i>
forbid	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. <i>The cliffs forbid any easy turning movement.</i>
foreclose	Subject to foreclosing procedures; take away the right of mortgagors to redeem their mortgage. <i>The bank was threatening to foreclose on his mortgage.</i>
forestall	Act in advance of; deal with ahead of time. <i>He would have spoken but David forestalled him.</i>

forfend	Avert or prevent (something evil or unpleasant). <i>The sacrifice of Mississippi was forfended against even the treason of Wilkinson.</i>
fungicide	Any agent that destroys or prevents the growth of fungi. <i>Cut away any rotten parts before dusting with fungicide.</i>
hack	An act of computer hacking. <i>I was waking up in the middle of the night and coughing and hacking for hours.</i>
hinder	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The hinder part of a carcass.</i>
illegalize	Declare illegal; outlaw.
impede	Block passage through. <i>The sap causes swelling which can impede breathing.</i>
inhibit	Make (someone) self-conscious and as a result unable to act naturally. <i>His father's cold and distant demeanor inhibited him emotionally.</i>
insulate	Make (land) into an island. <i>The room was heavily insulated against all outside noise.</i>
nag	A person who nags someone. <i>She nagged to take a vacation.</i>
obstruct	Commit the offence of intentionally hindering (a police officer). <i>An indirect free kick is awarded for intentionally obstructing an opponent.</i>
occlude	Cover (an eye) to prevent its use. <i>Occluded within these crystals are other molecules.</i>
preclude	Prevent from happening; make impossible. <i>Your role in the projects precludes your involvement in the competitive project.</i>
prevent	Keep from happening or arising; make impossible. <i>Action must be taken to prevent further accidents.</i>
shackle	Chain with shackles. <i>The prisoner was shackled to the heavy steel chair in the centre of the room.</i>
stonewall	Delay or obstruct (a request, process, or person) by refusing to answer questions or by being evasive. <i>I have repeatedly given him the opportunity to clear this matter up but the estate has met with stonewall after stonewall.</i>
stymie	Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of. <i>The changes must not be allowed to stymie new medical treatments.</i>
