Associations of "Hand to mouth" (30 Words)

cheek	Either side of the face below the eye. <i>Gabriel had to bite his cheeks to keep from laughing.</i>
chew	A chewy sweet. <i>She chewed at a fingernail.</i>
chewing	Biting and grinding food in your mouth so it becomes soft enough to swallow.
chin	Raise oneself while hanging from one's hands until one's chin is level with the support bar. <i>He looked about ready to chin someone.</i>
choking	The act of suffocating (someone) by constricting the windpipe. <i>No evidence that the choking was done by the accused.</i>
chomp	Munch or chew noisily or vigorously. <i>She chomped on a roll.</i>
dentist	A person qualified to practice dentistry. <i>His mouth is still sore from his visit to the dentist s.</i>
epiglottis	A flap of cartilage behind the root of the tongue, which is depressed during swallowing to cover the opening of the windpipe.
forehead	The part of the face above the eyes.
gargle	Utter with gargling or burbling sounds. <i>A gargle for sore throats.</i>
gnash	(of teeth) strike together; grind. <i>The dog's jaws were primed to gnash.</i>
gum	Cover, fill, fix, or smear with or as if with gum. <i>These trees gum in the Spring.</i>
halitosis	Offensive breath.
hyoid	Relating to the hyoid or structures associated with it.

implant	Provide someone or something with something by implantation. <i>A silicone breast implant.</i>
jaw	The lower movable bone of the jaw or the part of the face containing it. <i>I was too busy to spend time jawing with the rest of the crew.</i>
lengthiness	Amount or degree or range to which something extends.
lingua	A mobile mass of muscular tissue covered with mucous membrane and located in the oral cavity.
lip	(of the ball) hit the rim of (a hole) but fail to go in. <i>The lip of the cup.</i>
mastication	Biting and grinding food in your mouth so it becomes soft enough to swallow.
molar	Grinding tooth with a broad crown located behind the premolars. <i>Such molar problems of personality as the ego functions.</i>
orthodontics	The branch of dentistry dealing with the prevention or correction of irregularities of the teeth.
puppet	A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A former revolutionary hero who is now a puppet of the state.</i>
spit	The act of spitting forcefully expelling saliva. <i>He was spitting with sudden fury.</i>
stifler	A person who stifles or smothers or suppresses. <i>He is a real conversation stifler.</i>
throat	The part of an animal's body that corresponds to a person's throat. <i>A gold pendant gleamed at her throat.</i>
tongue	Sound a note distinctly on a wind instrument by interrupting the air flow with the tongue. <i>The other horse tongued every part of the colt's mane.</i>
tooth	Something resembling the tooth of an animal. <i>The paper used in copying machines is good as it has tooth and takes ink well.</i>
toothpaste	A dentifrice in the form of a paste. <i>Fluoride toothpastes.</i>
ventriloquist	A performer who projects the voice into a wooden dummy.
