Handling as a Noun

Definitions of "Handling" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “handling” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The management of someone or something.*
- *The action of touching with the hands (or the skillful use of the hands) or by the use of mechanical means.*
- *Manual (or mechanical) carrying or moving or delivering or working with something.*



Synonyms of "Handling" as a noun (2 Words)

manipulation The action of manipulating something in a skilful manner.
*His **manipulation** of his friends was scandalous.*

treatment A manner of dealing with something artistically.
*The directive required equal **treatment** for men and women in social security schemes.*



Usage Examples of "Handling" as a noun

- *The handling of prisoners.*



Associations of "Handling" (30 Words)

- alleviate** Make easier.
*He couldn't prevent her pain only **alleviate** it.*
- allow** Allow the other baseball team to score.
*She was **allowed** a higher profile.*
- applicant** A person who requests or seeks something such as assistance or employment or admission.
*A job **applicant**.*
- bungling** Making or characterized by many clumsy mistakes.
*He was heavily criticized for his **bungling** of the case.*
- conjugate** A mixture of two partially miscible liquids A and B produces two conjugate solutions one of A in B and another of B in A.
*E coli only **conjugate** when one of the cells possesses fertility genes.*

<u>ease</u>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>I was always vexed by her self contained ease.</i>
enable	Render capable or able for some task. <i>The Department is leading the effort to enable a smooth and timely transition.</i>
enabling	Providing legal power or sanction. <i>An enabling resolution.</i>
entitle	Give a title to. <i>The landlord is entitled to require references.</i>
<u>exam</u>	A medical test of a specified kind. <i>Exam results.</i>
facilitate	Make (an action or process) easy or easier. <i>The stimulus facilitates a delayed impulse.</i>
<u>feckless</u>	Lacking initiative or strength of character; irresponsible. <i>Her feckless younger brother.</i>
geek	Be or become extremely excited or enthusiastic about a subject, typically one of specialist or minority interest. <i>I am totally geeking out over this upcoming film.</i>
incompetent	An incompetent person. <i>The patient is deemed legally incompetent.</i>
<u>inconsiderate</u>	Without proper consideration or reflection. <i>Shockingly inconsiderate behavior.</i>
<u>ineffective</u>	Lacking the ability or skill to perform effectively; inadequate. <i>An ineffective administration.</i>
ineligible	Legally or officially unable to be considered for a position or benefit. <i>Ineligible to vote.</i>
inept	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.</i>
<u>let</u>	Award (a contract for a project) to an applicant. <i>They ve let out their house.</i>
licensee	Someone to whom a license is granted.
maladroit	Not adroit. <i>Maladroit propaganda.</i>
<u>manipulation</u>	The action of manipulating someone in a clever or unscrupulous way. <i>There was no deliberate manipulation of visitors emotions.</i>
<u>permit</u>	Officially allow (someone) to do something. <i>The camp permits of no really successful defence.</i>

- processing** Preparing or putting through a prescribed procedure.
*The **processing** of ore to obtain minerals.*
- qualify** Become officially recognized as a practitioner of a particular profession or activity, typically by undertaking a course and passing examinations.
*The training necessary to **qualify** as a solicitor.*
- tactless** Having or showing a lack of skill and sensitivity in dealing with others or with difficult issues.
*A **tactless** remark.*
- task** Assign a task to.
*I **tasked** him with looking after the children.*
- thereby** By that means or because of that.
*Students perform in hospitals **thereby** gaining a deeper awareness of the therapeutic power of music.*
- unskilled** Lacking professional skill or expertise.
*Workers in **unskilled** occupations are finding fewer and fewer job opportunities.*
- unskillful** Poorly done.
*It was an **unskillful** attempt.*
