script Printed type imitating handwriting.

Her neat tidy **script**.

writing Handwriting.

She did the thinking while he did the **writing**.



Usage Examples of "Handwriting" as a noun

- Handwriting can be slow and painful for one with arthritis.
- This method of duplicating can reproduce typewriting, handwriting, or drawings.
- Her handwriting was small and neat.
- She recognized his handwriting.

demotic Demotic Greek.

A poet with a keen ear for **demotic** rhythms.

A long or elaborate essay or discussion on a particular subject.

disquisition Nothing can kill a radio show quicker than a **disquisition** on intertextual

analysis.

doodle Make a doodle draw aimlessly.

The text was interspersed with **doodle**s.



draft Select a player for a sports team through the draft.

The White Sox chose him in the 13th round of the 1990 **draft**.

dramaturgy

The art of writing and producing plays.

Studies of Shakespeare a dramaturary

Studies of Shakespeare s **dramaturgy**.

essay Attempt or try.

Donald **essay**ed a smile.

graffiti Write words or drawings as graffiti.

He **graffiti**ed his tag on a window and door.

hastily With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly.

Hastily he scanned the headlines.

illegible (of handwriting, print, etc.) not legible.

Illegible handwriting.

interpolation A remark interjected in a conversation.

Yields were estimated using linear **interpolation**.

journal Write in a journal or diary.

While abroad he had kept a **journal**.

ledger Fish using a ledger.

Ledger tackle.

legible (of handwriting or print) clear enough to read.

The original typescript is scarcely **legible**.

libretto The text of an opera or other long vocal work.

manuscript An author's handwritten or typed text that has not yet been published.

An illuminated manuscript.

A written message in business or diplomacy.

memorandum The two countries signed a **memorandum** of understanding on economic

cooperation.

Something reused or altered but still bearing visible traces of its earlier

palimpsest form.

Sutton Place is a **palimpsest** of the taste of successive owners.

proofreadRead (written or printed material) and mark any errors.

They must revise and **proofread** their work.

quickly Without taking pains.

We moved **quickly** to deal with our auditor s questions.

A bond by which a person undertakes before a court or magistrate to

recognizance observe some condition, especially to appear when summoned.

He was released on his own **recognizance** of 30 000.



scrawl Write (something) in a hurried, careless way.

The page was covered in **scrawl**s and doodles.

scribble An aimless drawing. *Illegible scribbles*.

scribe Mark the position of the lock body on the door edge then **scribe** a centre

mark.

Write a script for a play film or broadcast.

The playwright **script**ed the movie.

A sheet with several pages printed on it it folds to page size and is bound

signature with other signatures to form a book.

The **signature** of a senior manager.

sketch Make a sketch of.

Jeanne **sketch**ed and painted whenever she had the time.

transcribe Put (thoughts, speech, or data) into written or printed form.

Polymerases **transcribe** it into a long RNA molecule.

write Compose write and send a letter to someone.

He had to **write** a cheque for 800.
