<b>dexterous</b>	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i>A <b>dexterous</b> keyboard player.</i>
<b>functional</b>	Of or having a special activity, purpose, or task. <b>Functional</b> architecture.
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Pages of <b>helpful</b> information.</i>
<b>near</b>	Located on the nearside of a vehicle. <i>Walking in these shoes is the <b>nearest</b> thing to floating on air.</i>
<b>near at hand</b>	Being on the left side.
<b>nearby</b>	Close at hand. <i>The <b>nearby</b> towns.</i>
<b>nimble-fingered</b>	Having nimble fingers literally or figuratively; especially for stealing or picking pockets- Harry Hansen.
<b>practical</b>	Having or put to a practical purpose or use. <i>Woodworking is a <b>practical</b> art.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	Competent or skilled in doing or using something. <i>She felt reasonably <b>proficient</b> in Italian.</i>
<b>ready</b>	(of a thing) made suitable and available for immediate use. <i>A <b>ready</b> source of cash.</i>
<b>ready to hand</b>	Apprehending and responding with speed and sensitivity.
<b>serviceable</b>	Ready for service or able to give long service. <i>Sturdy <b>serviceable</b> laced up shoes.</i>

<b>skilful</b>	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A <b>skilful</b> midfielder.</i>
<b>skilled</b>	Having or showing or requiring special skill. <i>A <b>skilled</b> trade.</i>
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>A <b>useful</b> member of society.</i>
<b>user-friendly</b>	Easy to use.
<b>utilitarian</b>	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>Plain <b>utilitarian</b> kitchenware.</i>
<b>well designed</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

<b>adept</b>	Very skilled or proficient at something. <i>He is an <b>adept</b> at imitation.</i>
<b>adroit</b>	Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought. <i>An exceptionally <b>adroit</b> pianist.</i>
<b>available</b>	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>Refreshments will be <b>available</b> all afternoon.</i>

<b>conveniently</b>	In a convenient manner. <i>The switch was <b>conveniently</b> located.</i>
<b><u>craftsman</u></b>	(in the UK) a qualified private soldier in the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. <i>As an actor he was a consummate <b>craftsman</b>.</i>
<b>dexterous</b>	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i>A <b>dexterous</b> keyboard player.</i>
<b><u>ease</u></b>	Of share prices interest rates etc decrease in value or amount. <i>Shares <b>eased</b> 6p to 224p.</i>
<b>easy</b>	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. <i>The judge went <b>easy</b> on the young defendant.</i>
<b><u>masterful</u></b>	Having or revealing supreme mastery or skill. <i>A <b>masterful</b> assessment of the difficulties.</i>
<b>niche</b>	Place something in a niche or recess. <i>He believes he has found a <b>niche</b> in the market.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Capable of being obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>

<b>practiced</b>	Skillful after much practice. <i>A <b>practiced</b> marksman.</i>
<b>proficiency</b>	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>He demonstrated his <b>proficiency</b> in Chinese.</i>
<b>proficient</b>	A person who is proficient. <i>He became a <b>proficient</b> in Latin and Greek.</i>
<b>prone</b>	Lying face downward. <i>A child <b>prone</b> to mischief.</i>
<b>repairman</b>	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>
<b>seasoned</b>	Aged or processed. <i>A <b>seasoned</b> traveler.</i>
<b>skilled</b>	Based on or proceeding from the ability to do something well. <i>A <b>skilled</b> surgeon has many years of training and experience.</i>
<b>specialty</b>	An asset of special worth or utility.
<b>toolmaker</b>	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>Aspirins are <b>useful</b> for headaches.</i>
<b>utilizable</b>	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<b>veteran</b>	An ex-member of the armed forces. <i>The <b>veterans</b> laughed at the new recruits.</i>
<b>well</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>I don t feel very <b>well</b>.</i>
