delight	Take delight in. His <b>delight</b> to see her was obvious to all.

<u>ecstatic</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>Ecstatic</i> fans filled the stadium.
elated	Full of high-spirited delight. Dozens of <b>elated</b> fans welcomed the champions home.
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>Enjoy</i> privileges.
enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.
<u>euphoria</u>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.
exult	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i>Exult</i> ing in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
festal	Relating to or characteristic of a celebration or festival. A festive or <b>festal</b> occasion.
gaiety	Entertainments or amusements. The sudden <b>gaiety</b> of children s laughter.



<u>glad</u>	Causing happiness. Gave a <b>glad</b> shout.
gladden	Make glad or happy. The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladden</b> ed her heart.
happiness	State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy. She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.
<u>hilarious</u>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>The meal was noisy and <b>hilarious</b>.</i>
<u>jolly</u>	A happy party. We had a very <b>jolly</b> time.
joy	A thing that causes joy. I felt shame that I had ever <b>joy</b> ed in his discomfiture or pain.
<u>joyful</u>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. Make a <b>joyful</b> noise.
<u>joyous</u>	Full of or characterized by joy. Felt a <b>joyous</b> abandon.
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing</i> children.
<u>merry</u>	Offering fun and gaiety. Have a <b>merry</b> Christmas.
<u>pleased</u>	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. A <b>pleased</b> smile.
rapt	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. They listened with <b>rapt</b> attention.
rapture	Expressions of intense pleasure or enthusiasm about something. Leonora listened with <b>rapture</b> .
rejoice	To express great joy. I love to <b>rejoice</b> their poor Hearts at this season.
smile	Express with a smile. She greeted us all with a <b>smile</b> .
