blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
cheerfulness	A feeling of spontaneous good spirits. <i>Her brand of hearty cheerfulness.</i>
<u>contentment</u>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delight	Take delight in. <i>His delight to see her was obvious to all.</i>
delighted	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
<u>ecstatic</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.</i>
elated	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Dozens of elated fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
enjoy	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. <i>Enjoy privileges.</i>
enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
<u>euphoria</u>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
exult	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i>Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
festal	Relating to or characteristic of a celebration or festival. <i>A festive or festal occasion.</i>
gaiety	Entertainments or amusements. <i>The sudden gaiety of children s laughter.</i>

glad	Causing happiness. <i>Gave a glad shout.</i>
gladden	Make glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i>
happiness	State of well-being characterized by emotions ranging from contentment to intense joy. <i>She struggled to find happiness in her life.</i>
hilarious	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <i>The meal was noisy and hilarious.</i>
jolly	A happy party. <i>We had a very jolly time.</i>
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>I felt shame that I had ever joyed in his discomfiture or pain.</i>
joyful	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>
joyous	Full of or characterized by joy. <i>Felt a joyous abandon.</i>
jubilant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merry	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>Have a merry Christmas.</i>
pleased	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>A pleased smile.</i>
rapt	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. <i>They listened with rapt attention.</i>
rapture	Expressions of intense pleasure or enthusiasm about something. <i>Leonora listened with rapture.</i>
rejoice	To express great joy. <i>I love to rejoice their poor Hearts at this season.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. <i>She greeted us all with a smile.</i>
