

Deeply agitated especially from emotion.

distraught

He is terribly distraught.

frayed (of a fabric, rope, or cord) unravelled or worn at the edge.

An effort to soothe **frayed** nerves.

hard-pressed Facing or experiencing financial trouble or difficulty.

Feeling strained as a result of having demands persistently made on one;

harried harassed.

A harried expression.

pestered Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances.

Her poor **pestered** father had to endure her constant interruptions.

Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate out any solid

strained matter.

She gave a **strained** laugh.

Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed.

stressed He dropped out of the race clearly di**stressed** and having difficulty

breathing.

stressed out Suffering severe physical strain or distress.

troubled Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination.

His **troubled** face.

vexed (of a problem or issue) difficult and much debated; problematic.

The **vexed** issue of priorities.

worried Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc.

There was a **worried** frown on his face.






Usage Examples of "Harassed" as an adjective
