- Harden by reheating and cooling in oil.
- Make fit.
- Make or become hard or harder.
- Make or become tougher and more clearly defined.
- Become hard or harder.
- Cause to accept or become hardened to; habituate.
- Make or become more severe and less sympathetic.

He tried to **toughen** his son up by sending him to public school.






## Usage Examples of "Harden" as a verb
