- The fierce wind blew harshly on to my face.
- The offices are harshly lit by fluorescent lights.
- The pilot applied the brakes too harshly.

merciless Showing no mercy.

The **merciless** enemy.

**obduracy** Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.

persecutor Someone who torments.

He became known as a **persecutor** of dissidents.

Showing no pity; cruel.

A **pitiless** executioner.

Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty.

relentless Relentless persecution.

remorseless Without mercy or pity.

A **remorseless** killer.

rigid Not adaptable in outlook, belief, or response.

A **rigid** strip of metal.

rigor

The quality of being valid and rigorous.

The **rigor**s of boot camp.

rigorous (of a rule, system, etc.) strictly applied or adhered to.

The **rigorous** testing of consumer products.

Excessive sternness.

rigour

His analysis is lacking in rigour.



Having or showing no pity or compassion for others. ruthless

An act of **ruthless** ferocity.

Severely simple. severe

The damage is not too **severe**.

The fact or condition of being severe. severity Hay fever symptoms vary in **severity**.

Of or relating to or characteristic of Sparta or its people. spartan

**Spartan** courage.

Of a stern or strict bearing or demeanor forbidding in aspect. stern

The past year has been a **stern** test of the ability of British industry.

Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. strict

**Strict** standards.

stringency A state occasioned by scarcity of money and a shortage of credit.

Demanding strict attention to rules and procedures.

<u>stringent</u> **Stringent** safety measures.

In a stringent manner. stringently **Stringently** controlled.

Incapable of adapting or changing to meet circumstances.

unbending He was so **unbending** and uncompromising.

Deficient in humane and kindly feelings.

unkind A thoughtless and **unkind** remark.
