Definitions of "Haunted" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “haunted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a place) frequented by a ghost.*
- *Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something.*
- *Inhabited by or as if by apparitions.*
- *Showing emotional affliction or disquiet.*
- *Showing signs of mental anguish or torment.*



Synonyms of "Haunted" as an adjective (13 Words)

- anguished** Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain.
*An **anguished** conscience.*
- beleaguered** In a very difficult situation.
*He led a relief force to the aid of the **beleaguered** city.*
- cursed** Used to express annoyance or irritation.
*Not a **cursed** drop.*
- disturbed** Having had the normal pattern or functioning disrupted.
***Disturbed** behaviour.*
- jinxed** (usually used colloquially) causing or accompanied by misfortune.
- obsessed** Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something.
*Was absolutely **obsessed** with the girl.*
- oppressed** Subject to harsh and authoritarian treatment.
*His sympathies were with the **oppressed**.*

possessed	Influenced or controlled by a powerful force such as a strong emotion. <i>She ran like a possessed person.</i>
preoccupied	Engrossed in thought; distracted. <i>A preoccupied frown.</i>
tormented	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears. <i>He is a tormented genius.</i>
tortured	Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain. <i>A tortured witness to another's humiliation.</i>
troubled	Beset by problems or difficulties. <i>Fell into a troubled sleep.</i>
worried	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>Worried parents.</i>



Usage Examples of "Haunted" as an adjective

- *The hollow cheeks, the haunted eyes.*
- *A reputedly haunted room in the castle.*

- *Her expression became progressively more haunted.*
- *Became more and more haunted by the stupid riddle.*
- *A haunted house.*



Associations of "Haunted" (30 Words)

afraid	Worried that something undesirable will occur or be done. <i>She tried to think about the future without feeling afraid.</i>
alarming	Frightening because of an awareness of danger. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an alarming rate.</i>
appall	Strike with disgust or revulsion.
chilling	The process of becoming cooler; a falling temperature. <i>A chilling account of the prisoners fate.</i>
claustrophobia	Extreme or irrational fear of confined places. <i>The small stuffy room had begun to give him claustrophobia.</i>
dread	A person with dreadlocks. <i>He was stricken with the dread disease and died.</i>
extrasensory	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.
fear	Be sorry; used to introduce an unpleasant statement. <i>I fear for the city with this madman let loose in it.</i>
fearfulness	The trait of being afraid.
fright	Frighten. <i>She s had a nasty fright.</i>
frighten	Drive out by frightening. <i>Farmers are being frightened into scaling down their breeding plans.</i>
frightening	The act of inspiring with fear. <i>A frightening experience.</i>
ghost	Move like a ghost. <i>He detected a ghost of a smile on her face.</i>
horror	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>The mere thought of it gives me the horrors.</i>
obsess	Preoccupy or fill the mind of (someone) continually and to a troubling extent. <i>I became more and more obsessed by him.</i>
panic	Feel or cause to feel panic. <i>Panic selling.</i>
paranormal	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>What seemed to be paranormal manifestations.</i>
petrify	Change into stone. <i>Slogans petrify our thinking.</i>

psychic	The study of psychic phenomena. <i>Psychic trauma.</i>
psychological	Of or relating to or determined by psychology. <i>Psychological warfare.</i>
scared	Made afraid. <i>We re both scared of spiders.</i>
scary	Provoking fear terror. <i>It was scary the way they bonded with each other.</i>
spectral	Of or like a ghost. <i>Spectral emanations.</i>
spirit	Infuse with spirit. <i>They were arrested in the middle of the night and spirited off to prison.</i>
terrified	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. <i>The terrified horse bolted.</i>
terrify	Fill with terror; frighten greatly. <i>She was terrified he would drop her.</i>
terrifying	Causing extreme fear. <i>The terrifying events of the past few weeks.</i>
terror	Terrorism. <i>She had a terror of darkness.</i>
thriller	A suspenseful adventure story or play or movie. <i>A tense thriller about a diamond heist that goes badly wrong.</i>
timidity	Fear of the unknown or unfamiliar or fear of making decisions. <i>She believes everyone can overcome their timidity.</i>
