### Definitions of "Haunted" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “haunted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a place) frequented by a ghost.*
- *Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something.*
- *Inhabited by or as if by apparitions.*
- *Showing emotional affliction or disquiet.*
- *Showing signs of mental anguish or torment.*



## Synonyms of "Haunted" as an adjective (13 Words)

- anguished** Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain.  
*An **anguished** conscience.*
- beleaguered** In a very difficult situation.  
*He led a relief force to the aid of the **beleaguered** city.*
- cursed** Used to express annoyance or irritation.  
*Not a **cursed** drop.*
- disturbed** Having had the normal pattern or functioning disrupted.  
***Disturbed** behaviour.*
- jinxed** (usually used colloquially) causing or accompanied by misfortune.
- obsessed** Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something.  
*Was absolutely **obsessed** with the girl.*
- oppressed** Subject to harsh and authoritarian treatment.  
*His sympathies were with the **oppressed**.*

<b>possessed</b>	Influenced or controlled by a powerful force such as a strong emotion. <i>She ran like a <b>possessed</b> person.</i>
<b>preoccupied</b>	Engrossed in thought; distracted. <i>A <b>preoccupied</b> frown.</i>
<b>tormented</b>	Tormented or harassed by nightmares or unreasonable fears. <i>He is a <b>tormented</b> genius.</i>
<b>tortured</b>	Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain. <i>A <b>tortured</b> witness to another's humiliation.</i>
<b>troubled</b>	Beset by problems or difficulties. <i>Fell into a <b>troubled</b> sleep.</i>
<b>worried</b>	Anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i><b>Worried</b> parents.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Haunted" as an adjective

- *The hollow cheeks, the haunted eyes.*
- *A reputedly haunted room in the castle.*

- *Her expression became progressively more haunted.*
- *Became more and more haunted by the stupid riddle.*
- *A haunted house.*



## Associations of "Haunted" (30 Words)

<b>afraid</b>	Worried that something undesirable will occur or be done. <i>She tried to think about the future without feeling <b>afraid</b>.</i>
<b>alarming</b>	Frightening because of an awareness of danger. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an <b>alarming</b> rate.</i>
<b>appall</b>	Strike with disgust or revulsion.
<b>chilling</b>	The process of becoming cooler; a falling temperature. <i>A <b>chilling</b> account of the prisoners fate.</i>
<b>claustrophobia</b>	Extreme or irrational fear of confined places. <i>The small stuffy room had begun to give him <b>claustrophobia</b>.</i>
<b>dread</b>	A person with dreadlocks. <i>He was stricken with the <b>dread</b> disease and died.</i>
<b>extrasensory</b>	Seemingly outside normal sensory channels.
<b>fear</b>	Be sorry; used to introduce an unpleasant statement. <i>I <b>fear</b> for the city with this madman let loose in it.</i>
<b>fearfulness</b>	The trait of being afraid.
<b>fright</b>	Frighten. <i>She s had a nasty <b>fright</b>.</i>
<b>frighten</b>	Drive out by frightening. <i>Farmers are being <b>frightened</b> into scaling down their breeding plans.</i>
<b>frightening</b>	The act of inspiring with fear. <i>A <b>frightening</b> experience.</i>
<b>ghost</b>	Move like a ghost. <i>He detected a <b>ghost</b> of a smile on her face.</i>
<b>horror</b>	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>The mere thought of it gives me the <b>horrors</b>.</i>
<b>obsess</b>	Preoccupy or fill the mind of (someone) continually and to a troubling extent. <i>I became more and more <b>obsessed</b> by him.</i>
<b>panic</b>	Feel or cause to feel panic. <i><b>Panic</b> selling.</i>
<b>paranormal</b>	Denoting events or phenomena such as telekinesis or clairvoyance that are beyond the scope of normal scientific understanding. <i>What seemed to be <b>paranormal</b> manifestations.</i>
<b>petrify</b>	Change into stone. <i>Slogans <b>petrify</b> our thinking.</i>

<b><u>psychic</u></b>	The study of psychic phenomena. <b>Psychic</b> trauma.
<b><u>psychological</u></b>	Of or relating to or determined by psychology. <b>Psychological</b> warfare.
<b>scared</b>	Made afraid. We re both <b>scared</b> of spiders.
<b>scary</b>	Provoking fear terror. It was <b>scary</b> the way they bonded with each other.
<b>spectral</b>	Of or like a ghost. <b>Spectral</b> emanations.
<b>spirit</b>	Infuse with spirit. They were arrested in the middle of the night and <b>spirited</b> off to prison.
<b><u>terrified</u></b>	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. The <b>terrified</b> horse bolted.
<b>terrify</b>	Fill with terror; frighten greatly. She was terrified he would drop her.
<b><u>terrifying</u></b>	Causing extreme fear. The <b>terrifying</b> events of the past few weeks.
<b>terror</b>	Terrorism. She had a <b>terror</b> of darkness.
<b>thriller</b>	A suspenseful adventure story or play or movie. A tense <b>thriller</b> about a diamond heist that goes badly wrong.
<b>timidity</b>	Fear of the unknown or unfamiliar or fear of making decisions. She believes everyone can overcome their <b>timidity</b> .
