acquire	Locate (a moving entity) by means of a tracking system such as radar. <i>I acquired a strong aversion to television.</i>
acquisition	The action of acquiring something. <i>The acquisition of self control.</i>
approbation	Official approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
attainable	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>An attainable target.</i>
belong	Be a member of (a particular group or organization). <i>Where do these books belong.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>The dollars can be placed on deposit and earn interest.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The land could fetch over a million pounds.</i>
grab	A mechanical device for gripping an object. <i>The brakes grabbed very badly.</i>
hold	Have room for hold without crowding. <i>Hold hold he cried.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>A towel holder.</i>
host	Be the host of or for. <i>Canada was asked to host a Commonwealth conference in Ottawa.</i>
incur	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>
landlady	A woman who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
landlord	A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

let	Consent to, give permission. <i>Shall we go Yes let s.</i>
obtain	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i>
own	Have something as one s own possess. <i>I used to design all my own clothes.</i>
owner	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Restaurant owners.</i>
permission	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. <i>He received permission to go to Brussels.</i>
possess	Have possession of as distinct from ownership. <i>A terrible rage possessed her.</i>
possession	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. <i>That photograph was Bert s most precious possession.</i>
possessor	A person who takes, occupies, or holds something without necessarily having ownership, or as distinguished from the owner. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>
procure	Get by special effort. <i>He procured his wife to sign the mandate for the joint account.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>That hat is my property.</i>
proprietor	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant proprietors.</i>
regain	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>He soon regained his composure.</i>
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>The rise in council house rents.</i>
retention	The action of absorbing and continuing to hold a substance. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid retention.</i>
take	Occupy or take on. <i>They decided to take a small house in the country.</i>
