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## Associations of "Having" (30 Words)

<b>acquire</b>	Locate (a moving entity) by means of a tracking system such as radar. <i>I <b>acquired</b> a strong aversion to television.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	The action of acquiring something. <i>The <b>acquisition</b> of self control.</i>
<b>approbation</b>	Official approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>attainable</b>	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>An <b>attainable</b> target.</i>
<b>belong</b>	Be a member of (a particular group or organization). <i>Where do these books <b>belong</b>.</i>
<b>checkbook</b>	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>The dollars can be placed on deposit and <b>earn</b> interest.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The land could <b>fetch</b> over a million pounds.</i>
<b>grab</b>	A mechanical device for gripping an object. <i>The brakes <b>grabbed</b> very badly.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Have room for hold without crowding. <i><b>Hold hold</b> he cried.</i>
<b>holder</b>	A smallholder. <i>A towel <b>holder</b>.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>Canada was asked to <b>host</b> a Commonwealth conference in Ottawa.</i>
<b>incur</b>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses <b>incurred</b>.</i>
<b>landlady</b>	A woman who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
<b>landlord</b>	A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

<b>let</b>	Consent to, give permission. <i>Shall we go Yes <b>let</b> s.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you <b>obtain</b> the visa.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have something as one s own possess. <i>I used to design all my <b>own</b> clothes.</i>
<b>owner</b>	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Restaurant <b>owners</b>.</i>
<b>permission</b>	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. <i>He received <b>permission</b> to go to Brussels.</i>
<b>possess</b>	Have possession of as distinct from ownership. <i>A terrible rage <b>possessed</b> her.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. <i>That photograph was Bert s most precious <b>possession</b>.</i>
<b>possessor</b>	A person who takes, occupies, or holds something without necessarily having ownership, or as distinguished from the owner. <i>His father was the <b>possessor</b> of a considerable fortune.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Get by special effort. <i>He <b>procured</b> his wife to sign the mandate for the joint account.</i>
<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>That hat is my <b>property</b>.</i>
<b>proprietor</b>	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant <b>proprietors</b>.</i>
<b>regain</b>	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>He soon <b>regained</b> his composure.</i>
<b>rent</b>	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>The rise in council house <b>rents</b>.</i>
<b>retention</b>	The action of absorbing and continuing to hold a substance. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid <b>retention</b>.</i>
<b>take</b>	Occupy or take on. <i>They decided to <b>take</b> a small house in the country.</i>
