Synonyms of "Hazardous" as an adjective (16 Words)

chancy	Involving risks and uncertainty. <i>A chancy appeal at best.</i>
dangerous	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. <i>Insecticides which are dangerous to the environment.</i>
fraught with danger	Filled with or attended with.
high-risk	Not financially safe or secure.
<u>insecure</u>	Not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way. <i>The hinge is insecure.</i>
<u>perilous</u>	Full of danger or risk. <i>A perilous voyage across the Atlantic in a small boat.</i>
<u>precarious</u>	Not securely held or in position; dangerously likely to fall or collapse. <i>A precarious ladder.</i>

risky	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. <i>Extremely risky going out in the tide and fog.</i>
speculative	Not financially safe or secure. <i>Speculative knowledge.</i>
touch-and-go	Functioning correctly and ready for action.
tricky	Deceitful or crafty. <i>Applying eyeliner can be a tricky business.</i>
uncertain	Not established beyond doubt; still undecided or unknown. <i>An uncertain future.</i>
undependable	Not worthy of reliance or trust. <i>Evidence is scarce and often undependable.</i>
unpredictable	Not occurring at a regular rate or fixed intervals. <i>An unpredictable or indeterminable future.</i>
unsafe	Not safe; dangerous. <i>Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe.</i>
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Wild parties were never her scene.</i>



Usage Examples of "Hazardous" as an adjective

- *We work in hazardous conditions.*
- *It is hazardous to personal safety.*
- *Skydiving is a hazardous sport.*



Associations of "Hazardous" (30 Words)

burn	Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>Burned wood.</i>
<u>burning</u>	The act of burning something. <i>The burning midday sun.</i>
combustible	A combustible substance. <i>A combustible gas.</i>
<u>crisis</u>	A time when a difficult or important decision must be made. <i>The current economic crisis.</i>
danger	A dangerous place. <i>The dangers of smoking.</i>
dangerous	Likely to cause problems or to have adverse consequences. <i>Insecticides which are dangerous to the environment.</i>

deadly	Causing or capable of causing death. <i>A deadly enemy.</i>
dicey	Of uncertain outcome; especially fraught with risk. <i>Democracy is a dicey business.</i>
emission	The occurrence of a flow of water (as from a pipe). <i>Cuts in carbon dioxide emissions.</i>
flammability	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
hazard	The pocketing of the object ball. <i>We can form no calculation concerning the laws of hazard.</i>
incinerate	Destroy (something, especially waste material) by burning. <i>The paper incinerated quickly.</i>
insecure	Not sufficiently protected; easily broken into. <i>An insecure computer system.</i>
irradiate	Expose (food) to gamma rays to kill microorganisms. <i>Irradiate food.</i>
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
parlous	Greatly or excessively. <i>The General's position was parlous.</i>
perilous	Exposed to imminent risk of disaster or ruin. <i>The economy is in a perilous state.</i>
poison	Kill by its poison. <i>The poison of fascism.</i>
poisonous	Having the qualities or effects of a poison. <i>A poisonous snake.</i>
pollutant	A substance that pollutes something, especially water or the atmosphere. <i>Chemical pollutants.</i>
precarious	Not secure; beset with difficulties. <i>A precarious truce.</i>
radiation	The energy transmitted by radiation. <i>He was suffering from radiation.</i>
radium	An intensely radioactive metallic element that occurs in minute amounts in uranium ores.
risky	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. <i>It was much too risky to try to disarm him.</i>
threatened	Likely in the near future to become endangered. <i>The spotted owl is a threatened species not yet an endangered one.</i>

- toxicity** The degree to which something is poisonous.
*That was how I protected my partner from my family's **toxicity**.*
- toxin** A poisonous substance produced during the metabolism and growth of certain microorganisms and some higher plant and animal species.
- uneasy** (of a situation or relationship) not settled; liable to change.
***Uneasy** lies the head that wears the crown.*
- unsafe** Lacking in security or safety.
*Because the confession was unreliable the verdict was **unsafe** and unsatisfactory.*
- volatility** The property of changing readily from a solid or liquid to a vapor.
*A week of historic stock market **volatility**.*
