## Synonyms of "Hazardous" as an adjective (16 Words)

<b>chancy</b>	Involving risks and uncertainty. <i>A <b>chancy</b> appeal at best.</i>
<b>dangerous</b>	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. <i>Insecticides which are <b>dangerous</b> to the environment.</i>
<b>fraught with danger</b>	Filled with or attended with.
<b>high-risk</b>	Not financially safe or secure.
<b><u>insecure</u></b>	Not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way. <i>The hinge is <b>insecure</b>.</i>
<b><u>perilous</u></b>	Full of danger or risk. <i>A <b>perilous</b> voyage across the Atlantic in a small boat.</i>
<b><u>precarious</u></b>	Not securely held or in position; dangerously likely to fall or collapse. <i>A <b>precarious</b> ladder.</i>

<b>risky</b>	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. <i>Extremely <b>risky</b> going out in the tide and fog.</i>
<b>speculative</b>	Not financially safe or secure. <i><b>Speculative</b> knowledge.</i>
<b>touch-and-go</b>	Functioning correctly and ready for action.
<b>tricky</b>	Deceitful or crafty. <i>Applying eyeliner can be a <b>tricky</b> business.</i>
<b>uncertain</b>	Not established beyond doubt; still undecided or unknown. <i>An <b>uncertain</b> future.</i>
<b>undependable</b>	Not worthy of reliance or trust. <i>Evidence is scarce and often <b>undependable</b>.</i>
<b>unpredictable</b>	Not occurring at a regular rate or fixed intervals. <i>An <b>unpredictable</b> or indeterminable future.</i>
<b>unsafe</b>	Not safe; dangerous. <i>Drinking water in some areas may be <b>unsafe</b>.</i>
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i><b>Wild</b> parties were never her scene.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Hazardous" as an adjective

- *We work in hazardous conditions.*
- *It is hazardous to personal safety.*
- *Skydiving is a hazardous sport.*





## Associations of "Hazardous" (30 Words)

<b>burn</b>	Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i><b>Burned</b> wood.</i>
<b><u>burning</u></b>	The act of burning something. <i>The <b>burning</b> midday sun.</i>
<b>combustible</b>	A combustible substance. <i>A <b>combustible</b> gas.</i>
<b><u>crisis</u></b>	A time when a difficult or important decision must be made. <i>The current economic <b>crisis</b>.</i>
<b>danger</b>	A dangerous place. <i>The <b>dangers</b> of smoking.</i>
<b>dangerous</b>	Likely to cause problems or to have adverse consequences. <i>Insecticides which are <b>dangerous</b> to the environment.</i>

<b>deadly</b>	Causing or capable of causing death. <i>A <b>deadly</b> enemy.</i>
<b>dicey</b>	Of uncertain outcome; especially fraught with risk. <i>Democracy is a <b>dicey</b> business.</i>
<b>emission</b>	The occurrence of a flow of water (as from a pipe). <i>Cuts in carbon dioxide <b>emissions</b>.</i>
<b>flammability</b>	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
<b>hazard</b>	The pocketing of the object ball. <i>We can form no calculation concerning the laws of <b>hazard</b>.</i>
<b>incinerate</b>	Destroy (something, especially waste material) by burning. <i>The paper <b>incinerated</b> quickly.</i>
<b>insecure</b>	Not sufficiently protected; easily broken into. <i>An <b>insecure</b> computer system.</i>
<b>irradiate</b>	Expose (food) to gamma rays to kill microorganisms. <i><b>Irradiate</b> food.</i>
<b>neurotoxin</b>	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
<b>parlous</b>	Greatly or excessively. <i>The General's position was <b>parlous</b>.</i>
<b>perilous</b>	Exposed to imminent risk of disaster or ruin. <i>The economy is in a <b>perilous</b> state.</i>
<b>poison</b>	Kill by its poison. <i>The <b>poison</b> of fascism.</i>
<b>poisonous</b>	Having the qualities or effects of a poison. <i>A <b>poisonous</b> snake.</i>
<b>pollutant</b>	A substance that pollutes something, especially water or the atmosphere. <i>Chemical <b>pollutants</b>.</i>
<b>precarious</b>	Not secure; beset with difficulties. <i>A <b>precarious</b> truce.</i>
<b>radiation</b>	The energy transmitted by radiation. <i>He was suffering from <b>radiation</b>.</i>
<b>radium</b>	An intensely radioactive metallic element that occurs in minute amounts in uranium ores.
<b>risky</b>	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. <i>It was much too <b>risky</b> to try to disarm him.</i>
<b>threatened</b>	Likely in the near future to become endangered. <i>The spotted owl is a <b>threatened</b> species not yet an endangered one.</i>

- toxicity** The degree to which something is poisonous.  
*That was how I protected my partner from my family s **toxicity**.*
- toxin** A poisonous substance produced during the metabolism and growth of certain microorganisms and some higher plant and animal species.
- uneasy** (of a situation or relationship) not settled; liable to change.  
***Uneasy** lies the head that wears the crown.*
- unsafe** Lacking in security or safety.  
*Because the confession was unreliable the verdict was **unsafe** and unsatisfactory.*
- volatility** The property of changing readily from a solid or liquid to a vapor.  
*A week of historic stock market **volatility**.*
