## Haze as a Noun

### Definitions of "Haze" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “haze” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A very fine cloud of something such as vapour or smoke in the air.*
- *A slight obscuration of the lower atmosphere, typically caused by fine suspended particles.*
- *Confusion characterized by lack of clarity.*
- *Atmospheric moisture or dust or smoke that causes reduced visibility.*
- *A state of mental confusion.*



## Synonyms of "Haze" as a noun (10 Words)

**befuddlement** Confusion resulting from failure to understand.

**blur** A hazy or indistinct representation.  
*The words were a **blur**.*

**cloud** A cause of worry or gloom or trouble.  
*The sun had disappeared behind a **cloud**.*

**confusion** Uncertainty about what is happening, intended, or required.  
*He changed his name in order to avoid **confusion** with the notorious outlaw.*

**daze** Confusion characterized by lack of clarity.  
*His mother's death left him in a **daze**.*

**fog** Confusion characterized by lack of clarity.  
*A whirling **fog** of dust.*

**mist** A cloud of tiny water droplets suspended in the atmosphere at or near the earth's surface that limits visibility (to a lesser extent than fog; strictly, with visibility remaining above 1 km).  
*The peaks were shrouded in **mist**.*

**muddle** An untidy and disorganized state or collection.  
*He made a **muddle** of his marriage.*

**smog**

Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog.

*The fires caused widespread **smogs**.*

**vagueness**

Lack of preciseness in thought or communication.

*The scene had the swirling **vagueness** of a painting by Turner.*



**Usage Examples of "Haze" as a noun**

- *The cold air has no pollution and very little haze.*
- *An alcoholic haze.*
- *There was a thick haze on this October morning.*
- *The gathering haze of cigarette smoke.*





## Associations of "Haze" (30 Words)

<b>aerosol</b>	A container holding an aerosol. <i>The organisms are spread in the <b>aerosols</b> generated by showers.</i>
<b>air</b>	Expose to warm or heated air so as to dry. <i>To go and <b>air</b> myself in my native fields.</i>
<b>atmospheric</b>	Relating to the atmosphere of the earth. <i><b>Atmospheric</b> pollution.</i>
<u><b>churn</b></u>	Produce butter by churning milk or cream. <i>Her stomach was <b>churning</b> at the thought of the ordeal.</i>
<u><b>cloud</b></u>	Billow up in the form of a cloud. <i>The stars are obscured by the <b>clouds</b>.</i>
<u><b>cloudy</b></u>	Uncertain; unclear. <i>The issue becomes more <b>cloudy</b>.</i>

<b>coolant</b>	A liquid or gas that is used to remove heat from something. <i>Lathe operators use an emulsion of oil and water as a <b>coolant</b> for the cutting tool.</i>
<b>diesel</b>	German engineer born in France who invented the diesel engine 1858 1913. <i>Eleven litres of <b>diesel</b>.</i>
<b>drizzle</b>	Very light rain; stronger than mist but less than a shower. <i>Scotland will be cloudy with patchy <b>drizzle</b>.</i>
<b>droplet</b>	A very small drop of a liquid. <i><b>Droplets</b> of water.</i>
<b>exhaust</b>	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>She seemed to have <b>exhausted</b> all permissible topics of conversation.</i>
<b>fog</b>	(with reference to a glass surface) cover or become covered with steam. <i>The coffee helped clear the <b>fog</b> in my brain.</i>
<b>fumes</b>	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
<b>humid</b>	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>A hot and <b>humid</b> day.</i>
<b>mist</b>	Cover or become covered with mist. <i>A breeze cooled the <b>mist</b> of perspiration that had dampened her temples.</i>
<b>misty</b>	Full of, covered with, or accompanied by mist. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>moisten</b>	Moisten with fine drops. <i>The dew <b>moistened</b> the meadows.</i>
<b>overcast</b>	Sew with an overcast stitch from one section to the next. <i><b>Overcast</b> books.</i>
<b>pipe</b>	Convey water gas oil or other fluid substances through a pipe or pipes. <i>Outside at the back a curlew <b>pip</b>ed.</i>
<b>pollutant</b>	Waste matter that contaminates the water or air or soil. <i><b>Pollutant</b> gases.</i>
<b>pollution</b>	Undesirable state of the natural environment being contaminated with harmful substances as a consequence of human activities. <i>The level of <b>pollution</b> in the air is rising.</i>
<b>precipitation</b>	The falling to earth of any form of water (rain or snow or hail or sleet or mist). <i>The heavy post monsoon <b>precipitations</b>.</i>
<b>propellant</b>	An explosive that fires bullets from a firearm. <i><b>Propellant</b> gases.</i>



<b>rain</b>	Falls of rain. <i>The low sky <b>rain</b>ing over tower d Camelot.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Make (someone) annoyed or irritated. <i>Winds <b>roil</b> these waters.</i>
<u>sky</u>	Heaven; heavenly power. <i>Hundreds of stars were shining in the <b>sky</b>.</i>
<b>smog</b>	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>The fires caused widespread <b>smogs</b>.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Subdue insects especially bees by exposing them to smoke. <i>His dreams all turned to <b>smoke</b>.</i>
<u>steam</u>	Locomotives and railway systems powered by steam. <i>She wiped the <b>steam</b> off the mirror.</i>
<b>tobacco</b>	The plant of the nightshade family which yields tobacco native to tropical America It is widely cultivated in warm regions especially in the US and China.
