- A slight obscuration of the lower atmosphere, typically caused by fine suspended particles.
- Confusion characterized by lack of clarity.
- Atmospheric moisture or dust or smoke that causes reduced visibility.
- A state of mental confusion.

befuddlement Confusion resulting from failure to understand.

blur A hazy or indistinct representation.

Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog.

vagueness

Lack of preciseness in thought or communication.

The scene had the swirling **vagueness** of a painting by Turner.
