- *Indistinct or hazy in outline.*
- *Confused; uncertain.*
- *Vague or ill-defined.*



## Synonyms of "Hazy" as an adjective (28 Words)

- bleary** Indistinct or hazy in outline.  
***Bleary** eyed business travellers.*
- blurred** Not clear or distinct; hazy.  
*The camera caught only two **blurred** images.*
- blurry** Indistinct or hazy in outline.  
*The trees were just **blurry** shapes.*
- brumous** Filled or abounding with fog or mist.  
*A **brumous** October morning.*
- clouded** Unclear in form or expression.  
*His face was **clouded** with unhappiness.*
- cloudy** Clouded as with sediment.  
*A very grey **cloudy** day.*
- confused** Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity.  
*Bewildered and **confused**.*

<b>dim</b>	Made dim or less bright. <i>We like <b>dimmed</b> lights when we have dinner.</i>
<b>faint</b>	Lacking strength or vigor. <i>The <b>faint</b> murmur of voices.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b>.</i>
<b>fuzzy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Their former jolly sound has been drowned in swathes of layered <b>fuzzy</b> guitar.</i>
<b>ill-defined</b>	Poorly stated or described.
<b>indefinite</b>	Not clearly expressed or defined; vague. <i>Must you be so <b>indefinite</b>.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i><b>Indistinct</b> shapes in the gloom.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>muddled</b>	Not arranged in order; untidy. <i>Such a view reflects <b>muddled</b> thinking.</i>
<b>murky</b>	(of liquid) dark and dirty; not clear. <i>A <b>murky</b> dungeon.</i>
<b>muzzy</b>	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>Society's <b>muzzy</b> notion of tolerance.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits. <i><b>Nebulous</b> concepts like quality of life.</i>
<b>overcast</b>	Filled or abounding with clouds. <i>A chilly <b>overcast</b> day.</i>
<b>shadowy</b>	Insubstantial; unreal. <i>The <b>shadowy</b> world of covert operations.</i>
<b>smoggy</b>	Clouded with a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>The <b>smoggy</b> atmosphere of Los Angeles.</i>
<b>uncertain</b>	Not established beyond doubt; still undecided or unknown. <i><b>Uncertain</b> of his convictions.</i>
<b>unclear</b>	Not clear to the mind. <i>The law itself was <b>unclear</b> on that point.</i>
<b>undecided</b>	Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought. <i>The match was still <b>undecided</b>.</i>
<b>unsure</b>	Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance. <i>She was feeling nervous <b>unsure</b> of herself.</i>

**vague**

Of uncertain, indefinite, or unclear character or meaning.  
*Saw a **vague** outline of a building through the fog.*

**woolly**

Having a fluffy character or appearance.  
**Woolly** lambs.



**Usage Examples of "Hazy" as an adjective**

- *It was a beautiful day but quite hazy.*
- *Hazy memories.*
- *School-leavers were often hazy about employment.*
- *The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.*



## Associations of "Hazy" (30 Words)

<b><u>blur</u></b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The words were a <b>blur</b>.</i>
<b>blurred</b>	Unclear in form or expression- H.G.Wells. <i><b>Blurred</b> vision.</i>
<b><u>blurry</u></b>	Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible. <i>Their eyes were <b>blurry</b> with tears.</i>
<b><u>cloud</u></b>	Darken the sky with cloud. <i>The smoke <b>clouded</b> above the houses.</i>
<b><u>cloudy</u></b>	(of a person's eyes) misted with tears. <i>Gropes among <b>cloudy</b> issues toward a feeble conclusion.</i>
<b>condensation</b>	The act of increasing the density of something. <i>A readable <b>condensation</b> of the recent literature.</i>

<b>dew</b>	A beaded or glistening liquid resembling dew. <i>A cold heavy <b>dew</b> dripped from the leaves.</i>
<b>dim</b>	Make dim or lusterless. <i>The difficulty in sleeping couldn't <b>dim</b> her happiness.</i>
<b>faint</b>	Lacking clarity or distinctness. <i>She hit the floor in a dead <b>faint</b>.</i>
<b>fog</b>	Cloudiness which obscures the image on a developed negative or print. <i>A whirling <b>fog</b> of dust.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b>.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>A hot and <b>humid</b> day.</i>
<b>inconspicuous</b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>Only <b>indistinct</b> notions of what to do.</i>
<b>lightproof</b>	Not penetrable by light. <i><b>Lightproof</b> containers.</i>
<b>mist</b>	Spray finely or cover with mist. <i>Sardinia's origins are lost in the <b>mists</b> of time.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>It was their last night and Ruth turned her <b>misty</b> eyes to Fernando.</i>
<b>murkiness</b>	An atmosphere in which visibility is reduced because of a cloud of some substance.
<b>murky</b>	(of liquid) dark and dirty; not clear. <i>A government minister with a <b>murky</b> past.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>A giant <b>nebulous</b> glow.</i>
<b>obscure</b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>None of this should <b>obscure</b> the skill and perseverance of the workers.</i>
<b>opaque</b>	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Bottles filled with a pale <b>opaque</b> liquid.</i>
<b>smog</b>	Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>The fires caused widespread <b>smogs</b>.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Subdue insects especially bees by exposing them to smoke. <i>The fire produced a tower of black <b>smoke</b> that could be seen for miles.</i>

- turbid** Clouded as with sediment.  
*The **turbid** estuary.*
- unclear** Not easily deciphered.  
*The law itself was **unclear** on that point.*
- undifferentiated** Not different or differentiated.  
*By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet **undifferentiated** between male and female.*
- vague** Thinking or communicating in an unfocused or imprecise way.  
*He had been very **vague** about his activities.*
- wet** Wetness caused by water.  
*She said she d **wet** the tea immediately because they must be parched.*
- wispy** Lacking clarity or distinctness.  
*A **wispy** little fellow with small hands and feet.*
