- bleary** Indistinct or hazy in outline.
***Bleary** eyed business travellers.*
- blurred** Not clear or distinct; hazy.
*The camera caught only two **blurred** images.*
- blurry** Indistinct or hazy in outline.
*The trees were just **blurry** shapes.*
- brumous** Filled or abounding with fog or mist.
*A **brumous** October morning.*
- clouded** Unclear in form or expression.
*His face was **clouded** with unhappiness.*
- cloudy** Clouded as with sediment.
*A very grey **cloudy** day.*
- confused** Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity.
*Bewildered and **confused**.*

dim	Made dim or less bright. <i>We like dimmed lights when we have dinner.</i>
faint	Lacking strength or vigor. <i>The faint murmur of voices.</i>
foggy	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>My memories of the event are foggy.</i>
fuzzy	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Their former jolly sound has been drowned in swathes of layered fuzzy guitar.</i>
ill-defined	Poorly stated or described.
indefinite	Not clearly expressed or defined; vague. <i>Must you be so indefinite.</i>
indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>Indistinct shapes in the gloom.</i>
misty	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
muddled	Not arranged in order; untidy. <i>Such a view reflects muddled thinking.</i>
murky	(of liquid) dark and dirty; not clear. <i>A murky dungeon.</i>
muzzy	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>Society's muzzy notion of tolerance.</i>
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>Nebulous concepts like quality of life.</i>
overcast	Filled or abounding with clouds. <i>A chilly overcast day.</i>
shadowy	Insubstantial; unreal. <i>The shadowy world of covert operations.</i>
smoggy	Clouded with a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>The smoggy atmosphere of Los Angeles.</i>
uncertain	Not established beyond doubt; still undecided or unknown. <i>Uncertain of his convictions.</i>
unclear	Not clear to the mind. <i>The law itself was unclear on that point.</i>
undecided	Not brought to a conclusion; subject to further thought. <i>The match was still undecided.</i>
unsure	Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance. <i>She was feeling nervous unsure of herself.</i>

vague

Of uncertain, indefinite, or unclear character or meaning.
*Saw a **vague** outline of a building through the fog.*

woolly

Having a fluffy character or appearance.
Woolly lambs.



Usage Examples of "Hazy" as an adjective

- *It was a beautiful day but quite hazy.*
- *Hazy memories.*
- *School-leavers were often hazy about employment.*
- *The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.*



Associations of "Hazy" (30 Words)

blur

Make unclear indistinct or blurred.
*The words were a **blur**.*

blurred

Unclear in form or expression- H.G.Wells.
***Blurred** vision.*

blurry

Not clearly or distinctly visible or audible.
*Their eyes were **blurry** with tears.*

cloud

Darken the sky with cloud.
*The smoke **clouded** above the houses.*

cloudy

(of a person's eyes) misted with tears.
*Gropes among **cloudy** issues toward a feeble conclusion.*

condensation

The act of increasing the density of something.
*A readable **condensation** of the recent literature.*

dew	A beaded or glistening liquid resembling dew. <i>A cold heavy dew dripped from the leaves.</i>
dim	Make dim or lusterless. <i>The difficulty in sleeping couldn't dim her happiness.</i>
faint	Lacking clarity or distinctness. <i>She hit the floor in a dead faint.</i>
fog	Cloudiness which obscures the image on a developed negative or print. <i>A whirling fog of dust.</i>
foggy	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>My memories of the event are foggy.</i>
humid	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>A hot and humid day.</i>
inconspicuous	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.</i>
indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>Only indistinct notions of what to do.</i>
lightproof	Not penetrable by light. <i>Lightproof containers.</i>
mist	Spray finely or cover with mist. <i>Sardinia's origins are lost in the mists of time.</i>
misty	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>It was their last night and Ruth turned her misty eyes to Fernando.</i>
murkiness	An atmosphere in which visibility is reduced because of a cloud of some substance.
murky	(of liquid) dark and dirty; not clear. <i>A government minister with a murky past.</i>
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>A giant nebulous glow.</i>
obscure	Make obscure or unclear. <i>None of this should obscure the skill and perseverance of the workers.</i>
opaque	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Bottles filled with a pale opaque liquid.</i>
smog	Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>The fires caused widespread smogs.</i>
smoke	Subdue insects especially bees by exposing them to smoke. <i>The fire produced a tower of black smoke that could be seen for miles.</i>

- turbid** Clouded as with sediment.
*The **turbid** estuary.*
- unclear** Not easily deciphered.
*The law itself was **unclear** on that point.*
- undifferentiated** Not different or differentiated.
*By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet **undifferentiated** between male and female.*
- vague** Thinking or communicating in an unfocused or imprecise way.
*He had been very **vague** about his activities.*
- wet** Wetness caused by water.
*She said she d **wet** the tea immediately because they must be parched.*
- wispy** Lacking clarity or distinctness.
*A **wispy** little fellow with small hands and feet.*
