## Associations of "Headed" (30 Words)

<b><u>abode</u></b>	Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily. <i>My humble <b>abode</b>.</i>
<b>address</b>	Write the name and address of the intended recipient on an envelope letter or parcel. <i>She <b>addressed</b> my father as Mr Stevens.</i>
<b>addressee</b>	One to whom something is addressed. <i>The contents of the letters were calculated to cause distress to the individual <b>addressee</b>.</i>
<b><u>artifice</u></b>	Clever or cunning devices or expedients, especially as used to trick or deceive others. <i>An industry dominated by <b>artifice</b>.</i>
<b><u>concoct</u></b>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>She began to <b>concoct</b> a dinner likely to appeal to him.</i>
<b>consciously</b>	With awareness. <i>We don t <b>consciously</b> perceive everything that happens to us.</i>
<b>construct</b>	Draw with suitable instruments and under specified conditions. <i><b>Reconstruct</b> the events of 20 years ago.</i>
<b>deliberately</b>	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>The fire was started <b>deliberately</b>.</i>
<b>designed</b>	Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. <i>Well <b>designed</b> houses.</i>
<b><u>destination</u></b>	The place to which someone or something is going or being sent. <i>He was nearly exhausted as their <b>destination</b> came into view.</i>
<b>email</b>	Send an email to someone. <i><b>Email</b> messages.</i>
<b>gambit</b>	A chess move early in the game in which the player sacrifices minor pieces in order to obtain an advantageous position. <i>His resignation was a tactical <b>gambit</b>.</i>

<b>identification</b>	The process of recognizing something or someone by remembering. <i>Each child was tagged with a number for <b>identification</b>.</i>
<b>intended</b>	The person one intends to marry; one's fiancé or fiancée. <i>Your <b>intended</b> trip abroad.</i>
<b>intentionality</b>	The fact of being deliberate or purposive.
<b>intentionally</b>	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>I wasn't sure if it was <b>intentionally</b> funny or not.</i>
<b>knowingly</b>	In full awareness or consciousness; deliberately. <i>When a journalist <b>knowingly</b> misleads their readers.</i>
<b>mailing</b>	An item sent by mail, especially a piece of mass advertising. <i>The candidate sent out three large <b>mailings</b>.</i>
<b>minded</b>	Mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Career <b>minded</b>.</i>
<b>oriented</b>	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows <b>oriented</b> toward the ocean view.</i>
<b>purpose</b>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. <i>He is a man of <b>purpose</b>.</i>
<b>purposefully</b>	Intentionally and deliberately. <i><b>Purposefully</b> vague answers.</i>
<b>purposely</b>	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had <b>purposely</b> made it difficult.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<b>residence</b>	A large and imposing house. <i>He refused to live in the governor's <b>residence</b>.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	A deceptive maneuver (especially to avoid capture). <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
<b>sender</b>	Someone who transmits a message. <i><b>Senders</b> of unwanted emails.</i>
<b>skillfully</b>	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug <b>skillfully</b> restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
<b>willfully</b>	In a willful manner. <i>She had <b>willfully</b> deceived me.</i>
