Associations of "Headed" (30 Words)

abode	Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily. <i>My humble abode.</i>
address	Write the name and address of the intended recipient on an envelope letter or parcel. <i>She addressed my father as Mr Stevens.</i>
addressee	One to whom something is addressed. <i>The contents of the letters were calculated to cause distress to the individual addressee.</i>
artifice	Clever or cunning devices or expedients, especially as used to trick or deceive others. <i>An industry dominated by artifice.</i>
concoct	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>She began to concoct a dinner likely to appeal to him.</i>
consciously	With awareness. <i>We don t consciously perceive everything that happens to us.</i>
construct	Draw with suitable instruments and under specified conditions. <i>Reconstruct the events of 20 years ago.</i>
deliberately	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>The fire was started deliberately.</i>
designed	Planned or conceived in detail or for a specific purpose. <i>Well designed houses.</i>
destination	The place to which someone or something is going or being sent. <i>He was nearly exhausted as their destination came into view.</i>
email	Send an email to someone. <i>Email messages.</i>
gambit	A chess move early in the game in which the player sacrifices minor pieces in order to obtain an advantageous position. <i>His resignation was a tactical gambit.</i>

identification	The process of recognizing something or someone by remembering. <i>Each child was tagged with a number for identification.</i>
intended	The person one intends to marry; one's fiancé or fiancée. <i>Your intended trip abroad.</i>
intentionality	The fact of being deliberate or purposive.
intentionally	With intention; in an intentional manner. <i>I wasn't sure if it was intentionally funny or not.</i>
knowingly	In full awareness or consciousness; deliberately. <i>When a journalist knowingly misleads their readers.</i>
mailing	An item sent by mail, especially a piece of mass advertising. <i>The candidate sent out three large mailings.</i>
minded	Mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Career minded.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows oriented toward the ocean view.</i>
purpose	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. <i>He is a man of purpose.</i>
purposefully	Intentionally and deliberately. <i>Purposefully vague answers.</i>
purposely	On purpose; intentionally. <i>She had purposely made it difficult.</i>
recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
residence	A large and imposing house. <i>He refused to live in the governor's residence.</i>
ruse	A deceptive maneuver (especially to avoid capture). <i>Emma tried to think of a ruse to get Paul out of the house.</i>
sender	Someone who transmits a message. <i>Senders of unwanted emails.</i>
skillfully	With skill. <i>Fragments of a nearly complete jug skillfully restored at the institute of archaeology.</i>
willfully	In a willful manner. <i>She had willfully deceived me.</i>
