agglomeration	<i>The arts centre is an agglomeration of theatres galleries shops restaurants and bars.</i>
amass	Gather together in a crowd or group. <i>He amassed a fortune estimated at close to a million pounds.</i>
assemble	(of male moths) gather for mating in response to a pheromone released by a female. <i>Assemble your colleagues.</i>
batch	Batch together assemble or process as a batch. <i>I had nothing to do but batch the reports.</i>
bunch	Form into a bunch. <i>She bunched her fingers into a fist.</i>
bundle	Make into a bundle. <i>They bundled out into the corridor.</i>
caisson	A chest or wagon for holding or conveying ammunition.
cluster	Come together as in a cluster or flock. <i>Ten clusters from all the primary health centres were selected.</i>
collection	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>The collection of data.</i>
compost	Treat soil with compost. <i>Sweet peppers can be grown singly in pots of potting compost.</i>
congregate	Gather into a crowd or mass. <i>Some 4 000 demonstrators had congregated at a border point.</i>
flock	Come together as in a cluster or flock. <i>A flock of gulls.</i>
jam	A hold obtained by jamming a part of the body such as a hand or foot into a crack in the rock. <i>Mum dad and I jammed into the pickup truck.</i>
load	Place a load or large quantity of something on or in a vehicle ship container etc. <i>In addition to their own food they must carry a load of up to eighty pounds.</i>
lot	A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>It s just one lot of rich people stealing from another.</i>
multitude	A large indefinite number. <i>A multitude of TV antennas.</i>

nucleate	Form into a nucleus. <i>Nucleated cells.</i>
<u>overload</u>	Become overloaded. <i>Don t overload the car.</i>
<u>pack</u>	Seal with packing. <i>The murder trial packed the court house.</i>
pile	Place or lay as if in a pile. <i>A Victorian Gothic pile.</i>
plenitude	An abundance. <i>The plenitude of the Pope s powers.</i>
sheaf	A bundle of objects of one kind, especially papers. <i>The corn and barley had to be sheafed and stooked.</i>
<u>stack</u>	Arrange in stacks. <i>Stack the deck of cards.</i>
<u>stacked</u>	(of a woman) having large breasts. <i>Full sized washer dryers are replacing stacked units.</i>
superimpose	Place on top of. <i>Can you superimpose the two images.</i>
<u>swarm</u>	Of flying insects move in or form a swarm. <i>A swarm of insects obscured the light.</i>
ton	A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo equal to a metric ton 1 000 kg or 40 cu ft. <i>I feel tons better.</i>
