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## Associations of "Heard" (30 Words)

<b>aloud</b>	With relatively high volume. <i>He wept <b>aloud</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>audible</b></a>	Heard or perceptible by the ear. <i>Some ultrasound is <b>audible</b> to dogs.</i>
<a href="#"><b>audio</b></a>	An audible acoustic wave frequency. <i><b>Audio</b> equipment.</i>
<b>bell</b>	Preceded by a numeral the time as indicated every half hour of a watch by the striking of the ship s bell one to eight times. <i>Saved by the <b>bell</b>.</i>
<b>cackle</b>	A loud laugh suggestive of a hen s cackle. <i>Corporate luminaries <b>cackle</b> on about the importance of quality.</i>
<b>clang</b>	Make or cause to make a clang. <i><b>Clanging</b> metal.</i>
<a href="#"><b>click</b></a>	Click repeatedly or uncontrollably. <i>Martha <b>clicked</b> her tongue.</i>
<b>ding</b>	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were <b>dinging</b> softly.</i>
<b>doorbell</b>	A push button at an outer door that gives a ringing or buzzing signal when pushed. <i>Charlotte rang the <b>doorbell</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>echo</b></a>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>A blue suit that <b>echoed</b> the colour of her eyes.</i>
<b>gramophone</b>	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
<a href="#"><b>hearing</b></a>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>The court may stay execution pending a <b>hearing</b>.</i>

<b>jingle</b>	A light ringing sound such as that made by metal objects being shaken together. <i>He makes up advertising <b>jingles</b>.</i>
<b>listen</b>	Listen and pay attention. <i>I told her over and over again but she wouldn't <b>listen</b>.</i>
<b>loudly</b>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively loudly. <i>She spoke <b>loudly</b> and angrily.</i>
<b>noise</b>	Make a lot of noise. <i>He enjoyed the street <b>noises</b>.</i>
<b>phonic</b>	Relating to phonics. <i>The devices of poetry foreground <b>phonic</b> elements that are usually ignored in practical speech.</i>
<b>resound</b>	(of a sound, voice, etc.) fill or echo throughout a place. <i>The hall <b>resounded</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>reverberate</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>Her deep booming laugh <b>reverberated</b> around the room.</i>
<b>ring</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>An area of Soho had been <b>ringed</b> in red.</i>
<b>ringing</b>	The sound of a bell ringing. <i>A <b>ringing</b> voice.</i>
<b>sonic</b>	(of speed) having or caused by speed approximately equal to that of sound in air at sea level. <i>A <b>sonic</b> wave.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Phonetics an individual sound unit of speech without concern as to whether or not it is a phoneme of some language. <i>The beautiful <b>sound</b> of music.</i>
<b>telephone</b>	An instrument used as part of a telephone system typically a single unit including a handset with a transmitting microphone and a set of numbered buttons by which a connection can be made to another such instrument. <i>It was eight thirty when the <b>telephone</b> rang and I knew it was Chandler.</i>
<b>telephony</b>	The working or use of telephones. <i>Mobile <b>telephony</b>.</i>
<b>timbre</b>	The distinctive quality or character of someone or something. <i>A voice high in pitch but rich in <b>timbre</b>.</i>
<b>tocsin</b>	The sound of an alarm (usually a bell). <i>He used his resignation as a <b>tocsin</b> to warn of the danger of dictatorship.</i>
<b>tonic</b>	Music the first note of a diatonic scale. <i>A <b>tonic</b> reflex.</i>
