## Hearsay as a Noun

## Definitions of "Hearsay" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "hearsay" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- The report of another person's words by a witness, which is usually disallowed as evidence in a court of law.
- Gossip (usually a mixture of truth and untruth) passed around by word of mouth.
- Information received from other people which cannot be substantiated; rumour.

## Synonyms of "Hearsay" as a noun (9 Words)

nneein	A conversation about other people an instance of gossiping. <i>He became the subject of much local</i> <b>gossip</b> .
idle chatter	The state of an engine or other mechanism that is idling.
idle talk	The state of an engine or other mechanism that is idling.
mere talk	A small pond of standing water.
report	The act of informing by verbal report. <i>He was a person of bad <b>report</b>.</i>
<u>rumor</u>	Gossip (usually a mixture of truth and untruth) passed around by word of mouth.



rumour	A currently circulating story or report of uncertain or doubtful truth. <i>Rumour</i> has it that he will take a year off.
tattle	Gossip; idle talk. For each story of mine a titbit of town <b>tattle</b> must be exchanged.
tittle-tattle	Light informal conversation for social occasions.

## Usage Examples of "Hearsay" as a noun

- Everything they had told him would have been ruled out as hearsay.
- The admissibility of hearsay evidence in civil proceedings.
- According to hearsay, Bez had managed to break his arm.
