<b>amber</b>	A honey yellow colour typical of amber. <i>An <b>amber</b> light illuminated the room.</i>
<b>amethyst</b>	A violet or purple colour. <i><b>Amethyst</b> earrings.</i>
<b>anthracite</b>	Coal of a hard variety that contains relatively pure carbon and burns with little flame and smoke. <i>The <b>anthracite</b> finish on these cupboard doors.</i>
<b>auriferous</b>	Containing gold. <i><b>Auriferous</b> quartz veins.</i>
<b>coal</b>	A red hot piece of coal or other material in a fire. <i>The big ship <b>coaled</b>.</i>
<b>colliery</b>	A workplace consisting of a coal mine plus all the buildings and equipment connected with it.
<b>copper</b>	A reddish brown color resembling the color of polished copper. <i><b>Coppered</b> pins.</i>
<b>diamond</b>	A card of the suit of diamonds. <i>He led a small <b>diamond</b>.</i>
<b>excavation</b>	The act of extracting ores or coal etc from the earth. <i>There s an interesting <b>excavation</b> going on near Princeton.</i>
<b>gem</b>	Decorate with or as with gems. <i>This architectural <b>gem</b> of a palace.</i>
<b>gravel</b>	A stratum or deposit of gravel. <i>We <b>gravelled</b> the driveway.</i>
<b>jade</b>	A semiprecious gemstone that takes a high polish is usually green but sometimes whitish consists of jadeite or nephrite. <i>A <b>jade</b> figurine.</i>

<b>jadeite</b>	A green, blue, or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of sodium, aluminium, and iron and belongs to the pyroxene group.
<b>jewelry</b>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
<b>lode</b>	A rich source of something. <i>The tin oxide was very thinly scattered within the <b>lode</b>.</i>
<b>medallion</b>	Any of various large ancient Greek coins. <i><b>Medallions</b> of veal.</i>
<b>mine</b>	Excavation in the earth from which ores and minerals are extracted. <i><b>Mine</b> ores and metals.</i>
<b>miner</b>	Laborer who works in a mine. <i>He worked as a <b>miner</b> at Wearmouth Colliery for 27 years.</i>
<b>mineral</b>	Of or denoting a mineral. <i>It identifies the <b>mineral</b> or compound present.</i>
<b>mineshaft</b>	A deep narrow vertical hole, or sometimes a horizontal tunnel, that gives access to a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused <b>mineshaft</b>.</i>
<b>mining</b>	Laying explosive mines in concealed places to destroy enemy personnel and equipment. <i>A <b>mining</b> town.</i>
<b>necklace</b>	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>A diamond <b>necklace</b>.</i>
<b>nephrite</b>	A hard, pale green or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of calcium and magnesium.
<b>ore</b>	A monetary subunit in Denmark and Norway and Sweden 100 ore equal 1 krona. <i>A good deposit of lead bearing <b>ores</b>.</i>
<b>passageway</b>	A passage between rooms or between buildings. <i>The palace was full of secret <b>passageways</b>.</i>
<b>pearl</b>	A necklace of pearls. <i>The sweat stood in <b>pearls</b> along his forehead.</i>
<b>plutonium</b>	A solid silvery grey radioactive transuranic element whose atoms can be split when bombarded with neutrons found in minute quantities in uranium ores but is usually synthesized in nuclear reactors 13 isotopes are known with the most important being plutonium 239.
<b>quarry</b>	Extract stone or other materials from a quarry. <i><b>Quarry</b> marble.</i>

- quartz** A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
- uranium** A heavy toxic silvery-white radioactive metallic element; occurs in many isotopes; used for nuclear fuels and nuclear weapons.
