Synonyms of "Heartbreak" as a noun (25 Words)

Intense feelings of suffering; acute mental or physical pain. <i>His last agony</i> .
An acute but unspecific feeling of anxiety; usually reserved for philosophical anxiety about the world or about personal freedom. <i>Rock and pop have a tradition of celebrating adolescent</i> angst .
Extreme mental distress. She shut her eyes in anguish .
The property of having a harsh unpleasant taste. <i>He expressed bitterness over his dismissal without notice.</i>
Intense sorrow caused by loss of a loved one (especially by death.
A sad and depressed state; low spirits. <i>He was slumped in deep </i> dejection .
A bleak and desolate atmosphere. In choked desolation she watched him leave.



despair	A state in which all hope is lost or absent. In despair I hit the bottle.
despondency	Feeling downcast and disheartened and hopeless. An air of despondency .
devastation	The feeling of being confounded or overwhelmed. <i>The floods caused widespread</i> devastation .
distress	The seizure and holding of property as security for payment of a debt or satisfaction of a claim. <i>A ship in distress.</i>
<u>grief</u>	Intense sorrow caused by loss of a loved one (especially by death. <i>She was overcome with grief</i> .
heartache	Emotional anguish or grief, typically caused by the loss or absence of someone loved. <i>A good friend understands your heartaches as well as your joys.</i>
hurt	The act of damaging something or someone. Rolling properly into a fall minimizes hurt .
<u>misery</u>	A state of ill-being due to affliction or misfortune. A man who had brought her nothing but misery .
pain	An annoying or tedious person or thing. It s not a huge problem just a bit of a pain .
sadness	The quality of excessive mournfulness and uncheerfulness. She tired of his perpetual sadness .
<u>sorrow</u>	An event or circumstance that causes sorrow. It was a great sorrow to her when they separated.
suffering	Psychological suffering. Weapons that cause unnecessary suffering .
torment	A feeling of intense annoyance caused by being tormented. So great was his harassment that he wanted to destroy his torment ors.
<u>torture</u>	Unbearable physical pain. The torture I ve gone through because of loving you so.
<u>trauma</u>	Emotional shock following a stressful event or a physical injury, which may lead to long-term neurosis. <i>Rupture of the diaphragm caused by blunt trauma</i> .
unhappiness	Emotions experienced when not in a state of well-being. <i>Residents expressed their</i> unhappiness <i>at the council s decision.</i>



woe

Things that cause sorrow or distress; troubles. *The Everton tale of woe continued.*

wretchedness

The character of being uncomfortable and unpleasant. The misery and **wretchedness** of those slums is intolerable.
