Intense feelings of suffering; acute mental or physical pain.

An acute but unspecific feeling of anxiety; usually reserved for philosophical anxiety about the world or about personal freedom.

A ship in **distress**.

Emotional anguish or grief, typically caused by the loss or absence of

A feeling of intense annoyance caused by being tormented.

torment So great was his harassment that he wanted to destroy his

tormentors.

torture Unbearable physical pain.

The **torture** I ve gone through because of loving you so.

Emotional shock following a stressful event or a physical injury,

trauma which may lead to long-term neurosis.

Rupture of the diaphragm caused by blunt **trauma**.

Emotions experienced when not in a state of well-being.

unhappiness

Residents expressed their unhappiness at the council s decision.



woe

Things that cause sorrow or distress; troubles.

The Everton tale of **woe** continued.

wretchedness

The character of being uncomfortable and unpleasant. *The misery and wretchedness of those slums is intolerable.*
