## Associations of "Heavy heart" (30 Words)

<b>adipose</b>	Composed of animal fat. <i><b>Adipose</b> tissue constitutes the fat of meat.</i>
<b><u>burden</u></b>	A ship's carrying capacity; tonnage. <i>The <b>burden</b> of establishing that the authority had misused its powers rests upon the prosecution.</i>
<b>burdensome</b>	Undesirably restrictive. <i>The <b>burdensome</b> task of preparing the income tax return.</i>
<b>demanding</b>	Requiring more than usually expected or thought due; especially great patience and effort and skill. <i>He was a <b>demanding</b> baby and rarely slept through the night.</i>
<b>encumber</b>	Restrict or impede (someone or something) in such a way that free action or movement is difficult. <i>They had arrived <b>encumbered</b> with families.</i>
<b>encumbrance</b>	A mortgage or other claim on property or assets. <i>The horse raised its hind leg as if to rid itself of an <b>encumbrance</b>.</i>
<b>fleshy</b>	Resembling flesh in appearance or texture. <i>Her <b>fleshy</b> arms.</i>
<b><u>gale</u></b>	A storm at sea. <i>It was blowing a <b>gale</b>.</i>
<b><u>grueling</u></b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>A <b>grueling</b> campaign.</i>
<b>laborious</b>	Requiring considerable time and effort. <i>Spent many <b>laborious</b> hours on the project.</i>
<b>lien</b>	A large dark-red oval organ on the left side of the body between the stomach and the diaphragm; produces cells involved in immune responses. <i>They may assert a <b>lien</b> claim on your property.</i>
<b>liver</b>	Liver of an animal used as meat. <i>Cholesterol may accumulate in the <b>liver</b>.</i>

<b>lung</b>	Each of the pair of organs situated within the ribcage, consisting of elastic sacs with branching passages into which air is drawn, so that oxygen can pass into the blood and carbon dioxide be removed. Lungs are characteristic of vertebrates other than fish, though similar structures are present in some other animal groups. <i>The city had to be given <b>lungs</b> in the shape of open spaces squares parks and gardens.</i>
<b>obese</b>	Grossly fat or overweight. <i>One in ten people surveyed were <b>obese</b>.</i>
<b>onerous</b>	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>An <b>onerous</b> lease.</i>
<b>onus</b>	An onerous or difficult concern. <i>The <b>onus</b> is on you to show that you have suffered loss.</i>
<b>overtax</b>	Make excessive demands on (a person's strength, abilities, etc). <i>Do athletes <b>overtax</b> their hearts.</i>
<b>overweight</b>	Put too much weight on; overload. <i>Two of the top three <b>overweight</b> sectors in the US market.</i>
<b>paunchy</b>	Having a large or protruding belly. <i>A slightly <b>paunchy</b> balding middle aged man.</i>
<b>physical</b>	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i><b>Physical</b> laws.</i>
<b>rainfall</b>	The fall of rain. <i>Low <b>rainfall</b>.</i>
<b>rainstorm</b>	A storm with heavy rain.
<b>reducing</b>	Any process in which electrons are added to an atom or ion as by removing oxygen or adding hydrogen always occurs accompanied by oxidation of the reducing agent. <i>A doctor supervised her <b>reducing</b>.</i>
<b>rotund</b>	Spherical in shape. <i>Her brother was slim where she was <b>rotund</b>.</i>
<b>tissue</b>	Tissue paper. <i>A slim package wrapped in blue <b>tissue</b>.</i>
<b>toilsome</b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i><b>Toilsome</b> chores.</i>
<b>tricky</b>	Not to be trusted. <i><b>Tricky</b> Dick.</i>
<b>weight</b>	A system of units used to express the weight of something. <i>As he came upstairs the boards creaked under his <b>weight</b>.</i>
