Synonyms of "Hegemony" as a noun (14 Words)

ascendancy	The state that exists when one person or group has power over another. <i>The ascendancy of good over evil.</i>
authority	Official permission or approval. <i>He is an authority on corporate law.</i>
control	The activity of managing or exerting control over something. <i>Growing controls on local spending.</i>
<u>dominance</u>	The predominance of one or more species in a plant or animal community. <i>All had in conformity with the principle of dominance round seeds with yellow cotyledons.</i>

dominion	The territory of a sovereign or government. <i>The Angevin dominions.</i>
leadership	The status of a leader. <i>They challenged his leadership of the union.</i>
mastery	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>Mastery of the seas.</i>
power	A state powerful enough to influence events throughout the world. <i>He was a power in the university.</i>
predominance	The quality of being more noticeable than anything else. <i>Hollywood's continued predominance in the international film market.</i>
primacy	The office, period of office, or authority of a primate of the Church. <i>The first years of his primacy were tranquil.</i>
rule	A rule or law concerning a natural phenomenon or the function of a complex system. <i>Violence is the rule not the exception.</i>
sovereignty	The authority of a state to govern itself or another state. <i>National sovereignty.</i>
supremacy	The state or condition of being superior to all others in authority, power, or status. <i>The supremacy of the king.</i>
sway	Pitching dangerously to one side. <i>The country was under the sway of rival warlords.</i>

Usage Examples of "Hegemony" as a noun

- Germany was united under Prussian hegemony after 1871.
- The consolidation of the United States' hegemony over a new international economic system.
- To say they have priority is not to say they have complete hegemony.
- The hegemony of a single member state is not incompatible with a genuine confederation.

Associations of "Hegemony" (30 Words)

administrate	Work in an administrative capacity; supervise or be in charge of. <i>The person administrating the database system has left the company.</i>
ascendant	Most powerful or important or influential. <i>That idea was in the ascendant.</i>

authority	A person or organization having political or administrative power and control. <i>He had absolute authority over his subordinates.</i>
<u>autocracy</u>	A political theory favoring unlimited authority by a single individual. <i>The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy.</i>
<u>checkpoint</u>	A place (as at a frontier) where travellers are stopped for inspection and clearance.
control	The activity of managing or exerting control over something. <i>Control the lever.</i>
dictatorship	A country governed by a dictator. <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship.</i>
disinformation	Misinformation that is deliberately disseminated in order to influence or confuse rivals (foreign enemies or business competitors etc). <i>The entire Western intelligence system had been systematically manipulated with clever disinformation.</i>
domineer	Rule or exercise power over (somebody) in a cruel and autocratic manner. <i>She doesn't domineer preferring to lead by inspiration rather than by intimidation.</i>
govern	Conduct oneself, especially with regard to controlling one's emotions. <i>The future of Jamaica will be governed by geography not history.</i>
manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. <i>She manages horses better than anyone I know.</i>
marketing	The action or business of promoting and selling products or services, including market research and advertising. <i>The Western arts of marketing and distribution.</i>
<u>mastery</u>	The act of mastering or subordinating someone. <i>She played with some mastery.</i>
mendacious	Not telling the truth; lying. <i>A mendacious statement.</i>
<u>mercenary</u>	A professional soldier hired to serve in a foreign army. <i>Mercenary killers.</i>
<u>military</u>	The military forces of a nation. <i>The military machine is the same one we faced in 1991 but now it is weaker.</i>

<u>misinformation</u>	False or inaccurate information, especially that which is deliberately intended to deceive. <i>Nuclear matters are often entangled in a web of secrecy and misinformation.</i>
officer	Provide with military officers. <i>He is an officer of the court.</i>
<u>overlord</u>	A ruler, especially a feudal lord. <i>The undisputed overlord of the crime family.</i>
personnel	The department responsible for hiring and training and placing employees and for setting policies for personnel management. <i>Many of the personnel involved require training.</i>
proficiency	The quality of having great facility and competence. <i>Practice greatly improves proficiency.</i>
<u>propaganda</u>	The dissemination of propaganda as a political strategy. <i>The party's leaders believed that a long period of education and propaganda would be necessary.</i>
reign	The period during which a monarch is sovereign. <i>She was hoping for a long reign as world champion.</i>
<u>repression</u>	A state of forcible subjugation. <i>Students sparked off events that ended in brutal repression.</i>
<u>ruler</u>	Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths.
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.</i>
<u>supremacy</u>	The state or condition of being superior to all others in authority, power, or status. <i>The supremacy of the king.</i>
<u>theocracy</u>	A political unit governed by a deity (or by officials thought to be divinely guided). <i>It is a society just emerging from theocracy.</i>
