<b><u>dreadful</u></b>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>The weather was <b>dreadful</b>.</i>
<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>A <b>fiendish</b> despot.</i>
<b>foul</b>	Not hit between the foul lines. <i>With its sails <b>afoul</b>.</i>
<b>frightful</b>	Provoking horror. <i>There s been a most <b>frightful</b> accident.</i>
<b><u>ghastly</u></b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>A <b>ghastly</b> pallor.</i>
<b>god-awful</b>	Very unpleasant.
<b>hadean</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of Hades or Tartarus.
<b><u>horrendous</u></b>	Extremely unpleasant, horrifying, or terrible. <i>She suffered <b>horrendous</b> injuries.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Provoking horror. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b>horrid</b>	Causing horror. <i>When she was bad she was <b>horrid</b>.</i>

<b>infernal</b>	Of or pertaining to or characteristic of a very uncontrolled and intense fire. <i>The <b>infernal</b> regions.</i>
<b>rotten</b>	Damaged by decay; hence unsound and useless. <i>He s had <b>rotten</b> luck this year.</i>
<b>satanic</b>	Extremely evil or wicked. <i>The Charismatic Movement continues its relentless search for evidence of <b>satanic</b> influence.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality. <i>The stranger gave a <b>terrible</b> smile.</i>
<b>unholy</b>	Unnatural and potentially harmful. <i><b>Unholy</b> grimaces.</i>
<b>vile</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>The <b>vile</b> development of slavery appalled them.</i>

<b>acutely</b>	In a shrewd manner. <i><b>Acutely</b> aware.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>exceedingly</b>	Extremely. <i>The team played <b>exceedingly</b> well.</i>

<b>exceptionally</b>	To a greater degree than normal; unusually. <i>The weather was <b>exceptionally</b> mild for the time of the year.</i>
<b>extraordinarily</b>	To a remarkable degree; extremely. <i>He did a good job in <b>extraordinarily</b> difficult circumstances.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a high degree or extent; favorably or with much respect. <i><b>Extremely</b> unpleasant.</i>
<b>hugely</b>	Extremely. <i>A <b>hugely</b> expensive house.</i>
<b>immensely</b>	To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>The president was <b>immensely</b> popular.</i>
<b>intensely</b>	With intense feeling or expression. <i>She <b>intensely</b> disliked any form of confrontation.</i>
<b><u>mightily</u></b>	Very; to a great degree. <i>This little town has contributed <b>mightily</b> to the life of the nation.</i>
<b><u>particularly</u></b>	Uniquely or characteristically. <i>A <b>particularly</b> gruesome attack.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers <i>real</i> is sometimes used informally for <i>really</i> rattling is informal. <i>I think she s <b>really</b> great.</i>
<b>remarkably</b>	In a signal manner. <i>He seems <b>remarkably</b> relaxed about the whole thing.</i>
<b><u>thoroughly</u></b>	Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for <i>thoroughly</i> . <i>We searched the files <b>thoroughly</b>.</i>
<b><u>tremendously</u></b>	Extremely. <i>I have been helped <b>tremendously</b> by my family.</i>
<b><u>truly</u></b>	In fact (used as intensifiers or sentence modifiers). <i>Management does not <b>truly</b> understand about the residents.</i>
<b>uncommonly</b>	Exceptionally. <i>He is an <b>uncommonly</b> good talker.</i>
<b>unusually</b>	In a way that is not habitual or common. <i>The name is spelt <b>unusually</b>.</i>
<b>very</b>	Used to emphasize that the following description applies without qualification. <i>She was <b>very</b> gifted.</i>

<b><u>atrocious</u></b>	Shockingly brutal or cruel. <i><b>Atrocious</b> taste.</i>

<b>disgusting</b>	Arousing revulsion or strong indignation. <i>A <b>disgusting</b> smell.</i>
<b><u>dreadful</u></b>	Very unpleasant. <i>A <b>dreadful</b> storm.</i>
<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>Stories about the <b>evil</b> effects of television on children make good copy.</i>
<b>execrable</b>	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i><b>Execrable</b> cheap wine.</i>
<b>fiendish</b>	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. <i>A <b>fiendish</b> despot.</i>
<b>frightful</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>Spent a <b>frightful</b> amount of money.</i>

<b><u>gory</u></b>	Covered in blood. A <b>gory</b> horror film.
<b><u>gruesome</u></b>	Causing repulsion or horror; grisly. <b>Gruesome</b> evidence of human sacrifice.
<b><u>heinous</u></b>	(of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked. <b>Heinous</b> accusations.
<b>horrible</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b><u>horrifying</u></b>	Provoking horror. A <b>horrifying</b> incident.
<b>infernal</b>	Irritating and tiresome (used for emphasis). The <b>infernal</b> regions.
<b>inhumane</b>	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Biological weapons are considered too <b>inhumane</b> to be used.</i>
<b>loathing</b>	A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred. <i>The thought filled him with <b>loathing</b>.</i>
<b>odious</b>	Unequivocally detestable. <b>Odious</b> hypocrisy.
<b>repellent</b>	A substance used to treat something, especially fabric or stone, so as to make it impervious to water. <i>I find his obsequiousness <b>repellent</b>.</i>
<b>repulsive</b>	Possessing the ability to repel. <i>The most <b>repulsive</b> character in recent novels.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Extremely unpleasant or disagreeable. <i>The stranger gave a <b>terrible</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>unpleasant</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude. <b>Unpleasant</b> odors.
<b>wicked</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. A <b>wicked</b> prank.
