Definitions of "Hello" as a noun

- *An utterance of ‘hello’; a greeting.*
- *An expression of greeting.*



Synonyms of "Hello" as a noun (11 Words)

address	Skill, dexterity, or readiness. <i>His address was abrupt and unceremonious.</i>
greeting	(usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>She raised her hand in greeting.</i>
hailing	Many objects thrown forcefully through the air.
hallo	An expression of greeting.
hi	An expression of greeting.
how-do-you-do	An expression of greeting.
howdy	An expression of greeting.
hullo	An expression of greeting.
salutation	An act of honor or courteous recognition. <i>We would not expect a love letter to include a formal address and salutation.</i>
saluting	An act of honor or courteous recognition.

welcome

The state of being welcome.
*Don't outstay your **welcome**.*



Usage Examples of "Hello" as a noun

- *She was getting polite nods and hellos from people.*

- Every morning they exchanged polite hellos.



Associations of "Hello" (30 Words)

adieu	A goodbye. <i>He whispered a fond adieu.</i>
aloha	An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>From the first aloha everyone is friendly and attentive.</i>
answer	Give the correct answer or solution to. <i>Write your answers on a postcard.</i>
bye	An automatic advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a bye into the second round.</i>
caller	A person who announces the changes of steps during a dance. <i>A special advice line was swamped by hundreds of callers.</i>
cheerfully	In a cheerful manner. <i>A cheerfully decorated tram car.</i>

client	A dependant; a hanger-on. <i>Workstation clients are going to be easy to install.</i>
cordially	With intense feeling. <i>He was greeted cordially by the archbishop.</i>
courteously	In a polite manner.
curtsy	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a curtsy to him.</i>
customer	A person of a specified kind with whom one has to deal. <i>He s a tough customer.</i>
goodbye	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our goodbyes and set off.</i>
<u>greet</u>	Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>Some of the customers greeted the barman in Gaelic.</i>
greeting	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>Mandy shouted a greeting.</i>
<u>guest</u>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A regular guest on the morning show.</i>
handshake	An exchange of standardized signals between devices in a computer network regulating the transfer of data.
hi	An expression of greeting.
<u>hospitable</u>	Favorable to life and growth. <i>Hospitable to new ideas.</i>
hospitality	The friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. <i>The BBC s hospitality suite.</i>
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
meet	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condtion ro restriction. <i>She took Paul to meet her parents.</i>
oh	A midwestern state in north central United States in the Great Lakes region.
<u>pledge</u>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>They pledged to continue the campaign for funding.</i>
politely	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>He waited politely for me to ask questions.</i>
salutation	A standard formula of words used in a letter to address the person being written to. <i>He raised his glass in salutation.</i>

salute	Make a formal salute to. <i>A musical salute to the composer on his birthday.</i>
welcome	Bid welcome to greet upon arrival. <i>Don't outstay your welcome.</i>
<u>welcoming</u>	Behaving in a polite or friendly way to a guest or new arrival. <i>A welcoming smile.</i>
yeah	Not only so, but.
<u>yes</u>	An affirmative. <i>I was hoping for a yes.</i>
