### **Definitions of "Hello" as a noun**

- *An utterance of ‘hello’; a greeting.*
- *An expression of greeting.*



## Synonyms of "Hello" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>address</b>	Skill, dexterity, or readiness. <i>His <b>address</b> was abrupt and unceremonious.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	(usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>She raised her hand in <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b>hailing</b>	Many objects thrown forcefully through the air.
<b>hallo</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>how-do-you-do</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>howdy</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>hullo</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>salutation</b>	An act of honor or courteous recognition. <i>We would not expect a love letter to include a formal address and <b>salutation</b>.</i>
<b>saluting</b>	An act of honor or courteous recognition.

The state of being welcome.  
*Don't outstay your **welcome**.*



### Usage Examples of "Hello" as a noun

- *She was getting polite nods and hellos from people.*



- *Every morning they exchanged polite hellos.*



## Associations of "Hello" (30 Words)

<b>adieu</b>	A goodbye. <i>He whispered a fond <b>adieu</b>.</i>
<b>aloha</b>	An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>From the first <b>aloha</b> everyone is friendly and attentive.</i>
<b>answer</b>	Give the correct answer or solution to. <i>Write your <b>answers</b> on a postcard.</i>
<b>bye</b>	An automatic advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a <b>bye</b> into the second round.</i>
<b>caller</b>	A person who announces the changes of steps during a dance. <i>A special advice line was swamped by hundreds of <b>callers</b>.</i>
<b>cheerfully</b>	In a cheerful manner. <i>A <b>cheerfully</b> decorated tram car.</i>

<b>client</b>	A dependant; a hanger-on. <i>Workstation <b>clients</b> are going to be easy to install.</i>
<b>cordially</b>	With intense feeling. <i>He was greeted <b>cordially</b> by the archbishop.</i>
<b>courteously</b>	In a polite manner.
<b>curtsy</b>	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>customer</b>	A person of a specified kind with whom one has to deal. <i>He s a tough <b>customer</b>.</i>
<b>goodbye</b>	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our <b>goodbyes</b> and set off.</i>
<b><u>greet</u></b>	Express greetings upon meeting someone. <i>Some of the customers <b>greeted</b> the barman in Gaelic.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>Mandy shouted a <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b><u>guest</u></b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A regular <b>guest</b> on the morning show.</i>
<b>handshake</b>	An exchange of standardized signals between devices in a computer network regulating the transfer of data.
<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b><u>hospitable</u></b>	Favorable to life and growth. <i><b>Hospitable</b> to new ideas.</i>
<b>hospitality</b>	The friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers. <i>The BBC s <b>hospitality</b> suite.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs.
<b>meet</b>	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condtion ro restriction. <i>She took Paul to <b>meet</b> her parents.</i>
<b>oh</b>	A midwestern state in north central United States in the Great Lakes region.
<b><u>pledge</u></b>	Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>They <b>pledged</b> to continue the campaign for funding.</i>
<b>politely</b>	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>He waited <b>politely</b> for me to ask questions.</i>
<b>salutation</b>	A standard formula of words used in a letter to address the person being written to. <i>He raised his glass in <b>salutation</b>.</i>

- salute** Make a formal salute to.  
*A musical **salute** to the composer on his birthday.*
- welcome** Bid welcome to greet upon arrival.  
*Don't outstay your **welcome**.*
- welcoming** Behaving in a polite or friendly way to a guest or new arrival.  
*A **welcoming** smile.*
- yeah** Not only so, but.
- yes** An affirmative.  
*I was hoping for a **yes**.*
